





#### Bowman **Community Chorus** Performs Dec. 7

Bowman Community Chorus will kick off the Christmas season this year with its 67th Christmas Concert, December 7, 2025 at the Bowman Lutheran Church, at 2:30 PM. The cantata they will be performing this year is "Night of The Father's Love". The Chorus will be singing a number of individual songs too. Megan Ehlers will be directing the Chorus this year. She is the music teacher in Hettinger, ND. It is her 1st year she has been involved with directing this Chorus. The Saxy Brass will perform during the prelude to the concert and also during the intermission. They will also do one number with the Chorus. Charmaine Martian, Bowman County High music teacher, is the director of that group of musicians.

Bowman Community Chorus has a rich and varied history. Joan Thom brought the Bowman Lutheran Choir and the Bowman Methodist Choir together in a Christmas Concert in 1959 and from there a new tradition was formed. She continued to direct the choir through 1968 Ron Bowman took over the directing duties the following year. Ron directed the Chorus through the years until 2019. There were a number of assistance directors from 2011 to 2019. Although Ron has passed from this life, we still do our best to continue to carry on the yearly traditional community concert at Christmas time.

Throughout the years, people from all walks of life have come together to enjoy performing in this wonderful musical opportunity. Over 650 people have sung with the group, throughout the years. Usually the group is about 40 or so strong, this year we have 37 voices. Parents, children and grandchildren have sung together. Ranchers, farmers, school teachers, business people have all worked together to make a tremendous musical experience and in only 8 or 9 practices, yearly!

In 1984, the Chorus started honoring longtime members with the 25 Year Club and added increments every five years. It is now up to the 50 year level plus for some. There are 46 members of the chorus over the last 67 years that have sung with the choir from 25 to over 50 years.

Although the focus of the Community Chorus has been on the Christmas Concert performed every first Sunday in December, they have sung for other functions also: The US

Bicentennial in 1976, the ND Centennial in 1989, the Bowman 100th in 2007, and several times at the Medora Musical. The Group has produced recordings (vinyl, CDs, and DVDs). Since 1986, the group has been performing their annual Christmas Concert at the Bowman Lutheran Church. Sixty seven years is quite a legacy.

The Chorus has supported music in Bowman County School, Scranton High School, and Harding County High School by providing summer music camp scholarships and to many students who have been a part of Northern Ambassadors of Music for their trips to Europe. We have a \$500 music scholarship available to a second year college music student too.

Come and enjoy an afternoon of good music. There will be refreshments after the concert where you can visit with the Chorus members and your friends and neighbors.

### Child Find Program **Needs Your Help!**

Every child in North Dakota is like a snowflake-unique in their abilities, background, and potential to grow. However, some infants and young children face special challenges that can make it harder to get a strong start in life.

The West River Student Services Unit, in collaboration with area school districts, has designated November 24-28. 2025, as Child Find Week in our communities.

Child Find is a federally mandated program under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act (IDEA) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act. Its purpose is to identify infants and children who may have developmental delays or disabilities and connect them with the supports and services they need to thrive.

Parents play a vital role in monitoring their child's growth and development. While every child develops at their own pace, it's helpful to be aware of general milestones and to notice if your child's progress seems slower than expected. Sometimes, because parents see their children every day, it can be easy to overlook small delays-so a gentle observation from a friend, neighbor, or relative can be the encouragement a family needs to seek help.

If you have concerns about your child's development, please contact your local school principal or Troy Knusdvig, Director of West River Student Services, at (701) 483-1257 ext.

A developmental screening can be scheduled to determine whether a delay may be present. If needed, early intervention services or activities can be provided to help your child grow, learn, and reach their full potential. The earlier a child receives support, the greater the opportunity for success.

At True Treatment, we strive to keep our athletes playing strong all season long. We have begun implementing an injury prevention warm-up across all of the Mott-Regent sports teams to help our athletes stay strong, healthy, and game ready. The

dynamic warm-up targets all major muscle groups to boost mobility, balance, and coordination. The program is inspired by FIFA's proven injury prevention program, however we have adapted it to apply to all athletes.

The warm-up takes about 10 minutes for teams to complete, and we recommend using it prior to each practice as well as before games. It is recommended to follow the warm-up with aerobic activity.

We wanted to involve all age groups, so a simplified version has been designed for our elementary athletes. Our goal is to create a healthy habit of warming up properly and to make it second nature for our athletes. We are hoping to see the warm-up reach every athlete in all sports so that we can reduce the risk of sport related injuries.

I'm still scratching my head on this one and, maybe someone can help me out. I've often written about these modern, helicopter, bulldozer, snowplow or whatever you want to call them "parents" who just can't seem to let their kids suffer the consequences of their actions. And, I'm not talking about a 6-15 yearold but, rather a technical minor who is about to turn 18 and become an adult. Everything from their pre-frontal lobe hasn't fully developed to their difficult upbringing or, the refrain, "they only act this way when their dad isn't around". Essentially, blaming everything under the sun except for assigning personal blame and consequences for their child's actions. Again, not something my father ever did. His analysis was that "of course I did it, guilty until proven innocent". Why? Because I was HIS son and, he knew that the acorn landed next to the root.

Case-in-point...some days ago, a 17-year-old (soon to be an adult) drove an automobile through a fence, killed a cow and injured all of his passengers THEN left the scene; and, failed to immediately report the accident to local law enforcement. Believe it or not, at least 2 offenses and, an assessment of from 6 to 18 points on the old driver's license...which he just got, right? 

We who live in this rural and agricultural region are well aware of the "circle of life." He comes, not only as a child, but as a Savior. He wants us to recognize in the "circle of life" that he comes again to nurture us, to help us grow, to call us to a deeper love. Let us begin again, following that cycle that leads us at last to the fullness of His Love.



By this chapter of my life I've learned I don't always have to have things perfect.



Alexis Cantrell began her career as a volunteer at Bristol Regional Medical Center in Tennessee. She received her Pharmacy Technician license and worked at a compounding pharmacy. She then up and moved halfway across the country to Hettinger, where she began her career here in the WRHS Billing Department, then became a CNA

at Western Horizons Care Center. We're glad Alexis landed in Hettinger and is willing to educate up!

The WRHS Foundation's Academic Loan Program is available to anyl Juniors and/or Seniors in their respective collegiate programs, pursuing a healthcare related degree where we are seeking employees. \$5,000 to \$10,000 is offered up front, with a signed employment contract to guarantee 10-20 months of employment with West River Health Services and/or Western Horizons Living Centers. The loan plus interest is then forgiven at \$500 per month of full-time employment. The best kind of loan we know

of – one that doesn't need to be paid back – rather a commitment of employment for a short period of time.

Our Healthcare Heroes Endowment Fund was created to build interest that could be utilized for Academic Loans. Although originally planned for collegians about to graduate, it has evolved into also offering current employees the opportunity to educate up as well. We are hoping to entice more college upperclassmen to apply for this program in the future (whether via larger loan amounts or increased personal interactions), as the timing of funding upfront and the length of required employment with West River's Academic Loan Program are far superior to other regional healthcare system's programs.







### Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig Last time we considered

1 Peter 2:19-20: "For this is commendable, if because of conscience toward God one endures grief, suffering wrongfully. For what credit is it if, when you are beaten for your faults, you take it patiently? But when you do good and suffer, if you take it patiently, this is commendable before God." We saw that if a believer patiently suffers for doing good, it is commendable before God. The word which is translated "commendable" is the word "grace." Verse 19 literally begins, "For this is grace." And at the end of verse 20, Peter says of suffering for doing good: "This is grace." We are being told here that patiently suffering for doing good is itself an act of grace. For grace, remember, is undeserved favor. The believer who unjustly suffers with patience is demonstrating God's grace and acting most like his

Peter elaborates on this theme in verse 21: "For to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should follow His steps." Here we are told the ultimate reason why the

crucified anyway. The soldiers beat and scourged and mocked Him. As they crucified the Lord Jesus. He endured incredible humiliation and pain. Yet even in the midst of such suffering, Jesus prayed for His persecutors.

But the greatest of all undeserved sufferings were endured by our Lord on the cross. During those hours of agony, He bore the sins of His people in His own body and was crushed for them in their place. The punishment which His children deserved, He endured ever so patiently. As Isaiah foretold hundreds of vears before, "As a sheep before its shearers is silent, so He opened not His mouth" (Isaiah 53:7). And in our verse Peter tells us who are believers in the Lord Jesus Christ that we are called to follow the example of our Lord.

Friends, I am concerned about the so called "Christian activism" that has become prevalent in recent years. Christians have been banding together, insisting on their rights and demanding political clout. Some of the issues they contend for are undoubtedly good. But is their way of going about it in accord with our verse? Believers are to EXPECT suffering and injustices. Paul wrote in 2 Timothy 3:12. "Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus

will suffer persecution." And we must receive those sufferings as our Lord did. We are to follow in His steps of enduring unfair and unjust treatment patiently for His sake. For this is a testimony to the world that what is important to the Christian is not how he is treated, but what a person does with Jesus Christ. Saving souls is more important than defending our rights.

Brothers and sisters in Christ, we are not to pursue life in this world like the unbeliever. This world is all he has. He has nothing to look forward to after death. But believers in the Lord Jesus are not in such a hopeless condition. It really does not matter very much what happens to us in this life. For the Lord is going to wipe away every tear, and all His children will enter an eternity of no more pain or suffering, only full enjoyment of Christ's love and blessings forever. And so, for the present, let us hold back nothing in living for our Lord, even If it brings suffering. This life is our only opportunity to win others to Christ and to follow in the footsteps of our Lord in suffering for the sake of His precious name. May our lives be used to draw others to place their faith in Christ alone for salvation and join us in living




