


Denver Firefighters Museum - Social Story -



I am going to visit the Denver Firefighters Museum. When I arrive, I will walk in through the front door.

It's the brown door in between the two big white doors, under a sign that says "Denver Firefighters Museum".



First, I will see a fire pole. Then, I will turn to the left, and check-in at the front desk.

The person there is very nice, and can help me if I have questions!






Going to new places can be overwhelming sometimes.

It has noise canceling head-phones, sunglasses, gloves, and fidgets.



I can't bring food or water into the exhibits.

But, I can leave these at the front desk, and the person who works there will keep them safe.

If I feel hungry or thirsty, I can go back and have a snack in the Snack Zone, then return to the exhibits when I'm ready!





In the museum, I will use my inside voice and walking feet.

Lots of the artifacts are old, so I can't touch them.

But, if I see Squirt the Fire Dog on something, I know I can touch it!



USING THE BATHROOMS

There are two bathrooms in the museum.

One is on the first floor, and it's for one person.

If it's being used, and I can't wait, I can go upstairs to the other bathrooms.

These have stalls, so multiple people can use them.






There are two floors in the museum.

On the first floor, there are footprints on the ground that I can follow and see the exhibits in chronological order.

Or, I can choose my own path!



The first thing I see will be a big hose cart.

There are also tools and other things I can learn about.



There is an old "watch desk" that makes sounds every now and then.

I will hear people talking about fires and fire engines.



This door looks like it's for me, but it's actually part of the exhibit. I shouldn't touch it.

If I forget, and try to touch it or open it, it will make a loud beeping sound.


Nothing bad will happen, and I won't be in trouble.

I can sit on the bleachers to watch the videos and learn about firefighting or fire safety.






FIRST FLOOR PLAY AREA

I will see a play area. There is a big red fire engine that I can play on! If I want, I can try on the kids' firefighting gear.

There is also a black pole I can slide down!

If other kids are around, it might be busy and loud here.



FIRST FLOOR TOUCH TANK

The touch tank has lots of artifacts that I can hold and learn about. There's even a binder that I can pick up and read!

When I'm done, I will put everything back into the tank where it belongs.



There are some real fire engines here! One of them, Engine No. 4, still works!

It's usually here at the museum, but sometimes, someone drives it away to a parade.

It might smell like gasoline for a little bit, but it's ok! The staff will open a door and let the smell out.



GETTING AROUND THE MUSEUM

There are two staircases that can take me to the second floor.

Both of them are ok to use.


They are completely safe, but they are a little bit creaky, so I might be noisy going up. That's ok!

I might notice that the floor is a bit creaky upstairs, too. That's because it's made of wood!




SECOND FLOOR LEARNING AREA
