Dear Sir,

You have possibly seen, in the Cycling Press and else where, a reference to my collection of cycling club badges, and I venture to enquire whether your Committee will be willing to allow me a specimen for inclusion. You have my assurance that the badge will not be worn in any way.

I am in receipt of your letter (which is dated the 8th instant, but did not reach me until some time after), with the badge, and I very much appreciate the sporting interest shewn by you and your Club in the collection.

I think you have reason to be proud of your badge, as so many of the newer clubs (I note that you were formed in 1929) adopt a stock design of badge, soon get tired of it, and then go to the expense of a new design. The idea of incorporating, with the cycle wheel, the chief feature of the place which gives its name to the Club, is a very good one. It is uncommon, something approaching it being the PETERBOROUGH CYCLING CLUB, which has a representation of the cathedral, but no cycle wheel or other emblem.

The collection is being formed "to be looked at," and I am anxious and pleased to shew it to anyone interested. If therefore you are in this neighbourhood at any time, be sure and let me know, though you will appreciate that any visit must be by appointment.

I venture to refund your postage, and I wish you and the Club all the very best of cycling success.
