## (u) the Hobo Trophy

The idea of a Hobo run was put forward by Bob Wright in 1942. Unfortunately he was killed in a motorcycle accident so in 1943 a Hobo Run was organised by Sandy Sandford and has been held every year since on the nearest Sunday to 5th November convenient for the CHIEF HOBO, who is elected by mutual consent at each meet for the following year, and has the responsibility for organising the following years run.

This trophy is a wooden shield provided by Doug Osmonde in 1945 with the names of the Chief Hobos burnt in and a crude holder for a photograph of the current holder.

In 1983 being no more room for names, Stan Bray got 'Pat' Howard, (a Founder member of the Tricycle Association) then 80 years old, a retired theatrical carpenter, to re-vamp the trophy by sawing it in half so that no names were lost and mounting the two halves on a large board.

The Taylor Brothers supplied a photograph of each Chief Hobo every year, and many holders collected it at the Club Dinner in their Hobo clothes.

He and his wife Laura put up riders at their homes in Eltham when riding in events in the London area.

## (g) SHAW-BLAKELOCK TROPHY

In 1962 two most promising members, John Shaw and Eric Blakelock, sons of well-known cycling families, were killed while on holiday in Germany. The Club made a collection throughout the Midlands raising over £400, and four identical trophies specially commissioned from Birmingham's famous jewellery quarter, a top class silversmith making deep relief likenesses of the two boys racing which were mounted on oak plaques with silver side plates for inscriptions. These four trophies were presented for award in branches of the sport in which John and Eric had already shown outstanding promise (a) TOURING, so one to the Birmingham District Association of the CYCLISTS TOURING CLUB for its Map Reading Competition, (b) PURSUING - so one to the Midland Division of the BRITISH CYCLING FEDERATION for its Team Pursuit Championship, (c) TIME-TRAILLING so a third to the MIDLAND COUNTIES CYCLING ASSOCIATION for its Open 100 miles event, and the fourth to the SOLIHULL CYCLING CLUB for its Open Junior Mass-Start event which had been organised in the Parks since the 1950's. In this way it was hoped that their memory would inspire young and upcoming cyclists throughout the Country.
