This will be a great day for all club members and we look forward to seeing you all on Sunday 9th June.





## RTTC Classic Series - Rounds 1-3

- 1. 24/3/19 10am Wessex RC P428
- 2. 7/4/19 10am Beacon Roads K22/37
- 3. 19/4/19 11am Buxton CC J8/3

After my success in Time Trialling at club level last year & varying success, or failure; if you're a pessimist of course, in regional & national hill climb events, after very little persuasion from some of my club mates I decided to take on open time trials as a key part of my cycling endeavours. However rather than just taking baby steps, I decided to mix the simplicity of time trials with the sadistic nature of hill climbs & spend the first half of my season tackling Mountain Time Trials, also known as SpoCos (Sporting Courses) or Hardriders events.



I had targeted the Sigma Sports RTTC Classic Series of Events, of which there are 6, Up & down the country, for no other reason than they stood out on the CTT website at the time & that the 2018 winner of the series showed up on one of our A Runs in December.

I started my season with a couple of warm up events on the first weekend in March.

Matlock CC Hilly 25 on the Saturday & Kettering CC SpoCo 20 on the Sunday.

I finished 2nd in both of those & was very pleased with my performances.

The Former Being more of what I'd expect from an event described as a "Classic", Farm Tracks with the gravel in the middle 6 inches thick, Climbs that last for 5 minutes Plus & epic peak district landscape. Whereas the Kettering one certainly has some ageing to do yet before Classic is used as a word to describe it.

Round one of the Classic series was 3 weekends after, Ran by Wessex RC on the P428 Course, it starts in Wimborne Minster in East Dorset & takes in a very picturesque part of the country over the 24 miles it covers.

The weather that day was lovely, you could've mistaken it for summer. The start had to be delayed by an hour because of an independent incident involving a car crash. This allowed traffic to build up on the course & was challenging at the best of times without having to deal with the increased traffic. However that being said the course was tame. Not too much in the way of obstacles or climbs. Which made it very fast indeed. The winner I think averaged over 30mph. I finished 7th & once again was pleased with my result as I felt I left nothing out on the course.

Only a break of two weeks, before I'm back at it. This time a Local one, Beacon Roads C & their Little Mountain Time Trial. This has been described as the only time trial you need to do before you die, & where, I feel, The word Classic really lives up to its name. The Event first being run in 1948 & being won by a Solihull Rider no less! That first year they had 39 entries, 5 of which were Solihull. This year they had well over 100 entries & we only had 2 entries. Entering alongside me was my hill climbing Amigo Richard.

The course is 37 miles long & has a total elevation gain of 1000m or 3300ft. It takes in the most testing roads Central Worcestershire has to offer including Stanford Bank, Ankerdine Hill & Shelsley Walsh Speed Hill Climb. That's not including all the other hills that make up the other 700m of elevation gain. Once again I

finished 7th & upon almost coming to a standstill at the top of the final climb, I knew id put 100% in.

Not even two weeks later, on Good Friday was the third round, Hosted by Buxton CC & starting in Longnor, in the Peak District. This was slightly different to the other two in that it's a course that you have to do 3 laps of. The Weather was as near as makes no difference, Perfect. The course was very technical & very up &



down. Pacing was key & good gear changing was even more essential than it normally is to holding a good speed. 1 lap was 11 Miles, Making it 33 miles in total with an elevation gain of 1200m. The landscape was, as you'd expect from the Peak District in perfect weather, sublime. However I still think the Beacon Roads course has the edge, as a course, the support from the side of the road is second to none in the Peak District. It

really gives you a lift as you struggle up a seemingly never ending drag for the third time in less than an hour. With it being a lapped course I used this to my advantage & decided to try & pace it a little better & trying harder with each subsequent lap. It seemed to work as I went one better this time & finished 6th. Beating a few riders who had beaten me in both the previous rounds.

As it stands I'm currently 4th in the series standings & I'm looking forward to the next three rounds, in Dumfries, The Lake District & The 2019 National Circuit Championships Near Avonmouth.

I Hope I can report on my results from these 3 events in the next magazine.
