It is my further express and unequivocal desire that on no account shall my Requiem Mass and internment be celebrated in English according to the '*Novus Ordo*' Lectionary of 1969, or any variant thereof. I absolutely reject the cremation of my body upon my death. In no way is my body to be cremated. Any cremation is contrary to my last wish and desire.
