A LITTLE ABOUT WHO YOU ARE HELPING

I first learned of this area of Maine when I my niece started her teaching career and was a 2nd grade teacher at Blue Hill Academy. As we talked, what continue to strike me was Katherine's comments about the financial circumstances of many of her students.

The Franklin County area is about 2 hours North of Augusta Maine where the median income is approximately \$45,541. Given its location, the average temperature in the winter is 15 degrees and the average cost to heat a home is between \$2,000 - \$3,000 annually. So families struggling financially have to juggle utility costs, food then try to figure out how they might give their children Christmas gifts.

Given the recent pandemic, we are all aware that there are individuals who are struggling to make ends meet. For folks that were struggling before, it only gets harder.

SPOTLIGHT DANIELLE FLANNERY & WMCA

I met Danielle last year when we made our first in-person delivery for Operation Santa. I was instantly struck by her kindness and giving spirit! She works "behind the scenes" at Western Maine Community Action (WMCA) and has been helping those in financial need for the last fifteen years. I wanted to do a spotlight so we could learn more about the individuals that this great organization helps and to give you more insight into the families we are helping with our *Operation Elves* donations.

When I interviewed Danielle, I was surprised and humbled to learn more about what Danielle describes as the "working poor" which is the big part of the community that WMCA supports. A typical "client family" will be a family of 4 (one adult and 3 children) who is trying to make it work on a \$12-hour job. They struggle to provide their families with food, heat, and shelter. Danielle's organization provides a number of programs that help families get heating fuel; however, they can't provide all the money that is required to provide adequate fuel throughout the cold northern winters. What this means, in reality, is these families are either setting their thermostat at 58-degrees all winter or going without some type of fuel for the equivalent of three months. And remember that the heating season up North starts in early November and lasts until the end of April.

Franklin County Maine is a rural community with jobs being up to an hour away for these working families. So the assistance that WMCA provides in terms of fuel, food, and rent assistance is critical to this community. Much of the money that WMCA uses comes through federal Government support. There are few individual donations to support the over 600 families and over 260 seniors they serve. With families struggling to just to get the basics, it was volunteerism and individual donations that helped to start the Operation Santa program.

At Christmas, these families just don't have anything extra to help make Christmas special or to get "presents" for their kids. So WMCA saw a need and wanted to keep the spirit of Christmas alive for these children and began Operation Santa in the 1960's and it continues today.

I always think the summer goes by too fast so I apologize for starting to focus on the fall.....a fall *road trip* that is.....



This month's Elf spotlight is **Beverly Nicklin** who also happens to be my mother.

I know my creative instincts come from my mother who learned from her mother. I started to sew by 4th grade as I had watched my mom make things as far back as I can remember. My mom made my sister's and my outfits for every special occasion when we are younger — sometimes staying up all night to finish a needed dress for Christmas or Easter.My grandmother was a seamstress and crocheted. Back in her day, my grandmother used to make doilies (I still have some) and taught my mother to crochet. And while my mother doesn't make doilies, she has been crocheting as long as she has been sewing. Like me, my mother needs to keep her hands busy and needs something to do as she watches TV so you can find her working on a baby blanket or kid's scarf or hat most days.

Three years ago, I wanted to help the community of Wilton, Maine after I learned from my niece that the community tended to struggle financially which would mean kids didn't get a lot for Christmas. As I cooked up this idea, my mom was the first one to say she would help. So in 2019, we managed to make 40ish blankets for kids and sent them in two boxes up to Maine. Then in 2020, not only did my mother (and my dad) help to buy the material for about 50 blankets; my mom made almost half the blankets we delivered last year. And this year, my mother has added "assembly line worker" to her list of helping skills. This past weekend, my mom helped to put cosmetic bags and "hat sets" together so they could be packed and ready to go.

I am so grateful for the help of so many people who are helping to touch the lives of others and making the holidays special for those who have little. And to achieve the goals we have in 2021, it truly takes the caring hearts of many individuals. Thank you, Mom, for helping to make Christmas special for many children by giving of your time, your financial contribution (thanks Dad), and your talents!
