I'd like to introduce you to *Aaron and Anissa Allumbaugh*.

While Operation Santa has been around for over 50 years, the Elks took it over 2 years ago. So Aaron, Anissa, and the rest of the organization have been on a steep learning curve to making sure that it goes off without a hitch and that they can make sure everyone who has a need gets served through Operation Santa. Oh, and did I mention that they added making deliveries to the area senior-living facility to their Christmas list of giving!

Aaron and Anissa are definitely most reluctant to be in the spotlight. Yet they truly give a tremendous amount of their time to helping others throughout the year as members of the Farmington Elks Club. As they describe all the activities they are involved in to help veterans, their community, and children - - I get tired thinking about it! And Aaron and Anissa would be quick to say, it's not just them but many of the Elk members who volunteer countless hours to raise money so that they can support others. In addition to Operation Santa, the Farmington Elks donate to the Maine Children's Cancer organization, help Veterans with medical supplies and other support, assist the elderly, and even create a Haunted House for less fortunate children at Halloween.

I asked them what is the hardest part of heading up Operation Santa and Aaron said "the concern that we will miss a child or forget something they requested". When I asked them what was the best part of being involved in this worthwhile endeavor they said "seeing the faces of parents and children knowing that they have made a difference – maybe created Christmas for families what would have nothing if there wasn't for Operation Santa".

EXTRA CREDIT PROJECTS

I hope you have had a chance to go onto the *Operation Elves Community* website (www.operationelvescommunity.org) and learn more about our mission and goals. One of our major focuses is to support the Operation Santa Christmas efforts by contributing: hat sets, blankets, and books for children up to age 18. And you can see from this month's totals that we are looking good to meet and/or exceed our targets. We are extremely grateful for all the donations we have received both financially and actual donated items. With the help of a couple of "elves", we are able to add a few extra things to our list that will help make Christmas special for those in need.

Newborns & Children Under 12 months old

Thanks to some elves going above and beyond, we are going to be able to give at least 10 "blanket sets" to newborn children. A blanket set consists of 1-baby blanket, 3 receiving blankets, and 3 bib/burb sets. Additionally, we have received a couple of generous monetary donations, so we will be able to buy five "sleeper sacks" for children between the ages of 6 – 12 months old.

Young Adults

This is a tougher group to buy for and as we all know their wish list gets much more expensive. So, we wanted to help this group with a few extra items. With the help of Mindy M putting in extra sewing hours, we will be able to donate 30 cosmetic bags for teenage girls and another 30 toilette bags for young men. And through another generous monetary donation, we will be able to donate: 5 camping tents, sleeping bags, and lanterns for young males and journals & associated supplies for teenage girls.

Seniors

The Farmington Elks extend beyond children during the holiday season and work to make Christmas special for those who are living in the area nursing home. And to support those efforts, we plan to donate 30 blankets that can be delivered to these individuals during the holidays

As always, I am grateful beyond words for the generosity and help that this community has shown in our efforts to help those in need. And not only are we going to be able to bring more of the basic items that will provide warmth & comfort, but we are also able to give a little bit more which we hope brings joy and smile to those who will receive these gifts this season!

Spotlight - Operation Elf Creator & Logistics Director Melissa (Mel) & Bill Stack

The first giving experience I remember was when I was about 11 years old. I had a doll that I loved but didn't play with anymore so it was saved in a box. Our church was asking for donations to less fortunate families....and I remember consciously deciding to give away something I liked for someone in need. Growing up I was taught, through watching my parents, to help others with my time and my gifts. As an adult, I have tried to be generous and help those in need – both people I knew and some I didn't.

Four years ago, my niece was telling me about the financial hardship of many of her students and my heart knew I had to do something to help. That first year, my mother and I made about 34 blankets for her to give to her students at Christmas. The following year, I got connected with Operation Santa so we could help more children in that area. By 2021, we created a community of like-minded, caring individuals, bringing to life Operation Elves. Our primary goal is to gather blankets, books, and hats/mittens for children newborn to 17. It is amazing what **you** have helped us accomplish in two years.

While I am grateful for all the donations and talented individuals – none of this would be possible without the help & support of my husband, Bill Stack. My focus is on complying all the donations and stuffing them into boxes. It is Bill who figures out how we are going to get everything into a vehicle or trailer so we can deliver it to Farmington Maine. He is the driver and the muscle. Yesterday, he packed 60 boxes into the trailer. A year's worth of work comminates into the last two weeks in September and the first week of October. It is here that Bill's talents are tested.

But his true support comes by agreeing to a percentage of the money I make through my consulting business to go directly to funding Operation Elves. And with that support, we have helped clients and a community.

It is satisfying to see a year's worth of work come together and to have a community of elves helping others. It continually reminds me how much I have to be grateful for in my own life.

It is my sincerest wish that we will continue to expand our reach through Operation Elves and bring joy and hope to those who may need the support through the kindness of a group of strangers. Know that your contribution is making a difference in the lives of children and creating joy during the holiday season.


