We raised the bar this year, increasing our goals by 17%—a big stretch! Even so, I'm thrilled to report that we have already reached our goals for blankets and hat sets. Huge thanks to everyone who helped us hit these two milestones!

As we move into the last six weeks of preparation before our trip North, our focus is now on closing the gap with books—we're aiming for 475 total. In addition, we're working on reaching our goals for toiletry bags for seniors, cosmetic bags for teenage girls, and earbuds for young adults.
