2024 GOAL UPDATE

It's hard to believe that it is June already! We have just four more months to prepare for our annual drive to Maine, where we deliver all the wonderful gifts that our elves have either made and donated or provided funds to purchase.

Our goal for 2024 is to collect 300 of each of our main items (blankets, hat sets, and books) for the children of Northern Maine. Thanks to some savvy shopping by Bev & Jim N and the help of Jean S, we are in great shape with hat sets. We may also have some new elves joining the blanket-making effort, which should help us reach our goal for blankets. The only area where we are a little behind is books. If you would like to help, you can order books on Amazon and have them shipped to me or send money so we can purchase them.

In addition to the items mentioned above, we have collected some winter jackets and anticipate getting tents on sale after the 4th of July. We are also working on making and stuffing cosmetic bags for young adults, with a goal of at least 40 bags. Currently, we have 15.

We also gather items for seniors, focusing on three main items: blankets, socks, and toiletry bags. We are on target for socks and blankets but are running a little behind on the toiletry bags. This summer, we will focus on completing the toiletry bags.
