Did You Know?

There is only one copy of the engrossed and fully signed Declaration of Independence! Printer John Dunlap made an estimated 200 broadsides in the first printing of the Declaration. One copy was signed by all 56 members of the Second Continental Congress several weeks after it was first published. This one is preserved in the National Archives building in Washington, D.C. The remaining Dunlap broadsides included only the names of John Hancock and Charles Thompson, and just 26 of those remain today.
