## Leading a Discussion on Church Relations

As soon as the semester ended at Matongo, Kenya, Walter traveled to The Republic of the Philippines to meet with the church leadership and with the faculty and students of Lutheran Theological Seminary, Baguio. While there, he preached and lead a Bible class at St. Stephen Lutheran Church and taught two classes at the seminary.

Our overseas partner churches are faced with many challenges. The Lutheran Church of the Philippines is dealing with the issue of the proper way in which to respond to membership in organizations which have drifted off course. They strongly desire to be faithful to Christ and his Word.

Walter was asked to lead a seminar addressing proper church relations, church fellowship, and being faithful as we Lutherans live among those whose understanding of the Gospel is, at the best, less-than-faithful.

Missionary work is not limited to one geographical location. The call extended to us, by you—the LCMS, is to the world. Much like the apostles and evangelists before us, we go where the Lord calls us. It was a joy for me to be there as we confessed our common faith together.

The Lutheran Church— Missouri Synod began work in the Philippines in 1946. The Lutheran Church in the Philippines (LCP) became an LCMS partner/sister church in 1971 and is a member of the International Lutheran Council. The LCP has over 23,000 baptized members in 190 congregations and preaching stations and a national staff of 301 pastors, evangelists, lay preachers and teachers. The church operates the Lutheran Theological Seminary in Baguio City, a preschool, six primary schools and a secondary school. In addition, the church is involved in Bible translation work and media work in cooperation with Lutheran Hour Ministries.

### A New Building for the Deaconess Students



As soon as the semester ended, construction began on a new building, funded by The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, to serve the growing deaconess student population at the Matongo Seminary.

This new building will house a Home Economics laboratory, which will better facilitate the teaching of nutrition, sewing, and embroidery. In addition, it will give the campus an additional classroom—one specifically set aside for the deaconesses. This is a welcome addition.

Not shown is another construction project—a new eight-room deaconess dormitory to meet the needs of our increasing enrollment.

We are looking forward to the return of our students later this month. Please pray for them, as, for many of these ladies, the trip to Matongo is long and dangerous.
