

Johann Konrad Wilhelm Loehe was a Confessional Lutheran pastor in Germany and a major founder of the deaconess movement in the Lutheran Church. His work also resulted in the founding of Concordia Theology Seminary, now in Fort Wayne IN.

It is appropriate that this facility, which holds two lecture halls and space of teaching sewing as well as food preparation and nutrition, should be named in his memory.

I am happy that LCMS has partnered with the Matongo Seminary to make this dream come true for our ladies.
