Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ *Happy spring!*

At the end of February, we celebrated our Open House, featuring some special artwork from West Branch school, our ministries, and Sojourner Truth Ministry's House of Hope- a project in the making to offer 6-month housing in a Christ-based healing atmosphere. The House of Hope will have mentors for each woman who resides there, with spiritual care as well as addressing the many barriers women in homelessness face. The end goal is for each resident to find her value in Christ, to replace the lies she has believed over time about her worth, and claim the healing only Jesus can offer. She will also have acquired life skills- communication, job, interviewing, anger management, managing money, and much more. Our desire is that those who complete their time in House of Hope will be well on their way to being productive members of our community, and willing to pour life into others. Reports were that we had nearly 200 people come through, and we got to meet many of you, for which we are grateful. It felt kind of like a reunion of sorts, seeing community and old friends all together, from different walks of faith and life was a highlight of my time as Director. Several people had offered their time, prayers, and talents to help make it all happen. The House transformation took place with literally hundreds of volunteer hours and many generous gifts. Thank you to PA Skills, to Greenview Alliance Church, Mansfield University, Lezzer Lumber, Harry F. Plankenhorn Foundation, St. Luke fund, St. Boniface, Pine St UMC, and many, many people who have chosen to give anonymously. To date, from the open house , more than \$12,600 has been raised for the House. As the Apostle Paul writes, "I thank my God for every remembrance of you".

Changes, Transformation, Opportunities, Partnering...

Changes: we have had to make them due to circumstances outside our control. We have continued to provide lunches to those who come, passing them through the door. In April, we served 1930 lunches to a lot of hungry people! As often as possible, we include Scripture nuggets with a meal, and frequently offer a take home devotion, written by a retired pastor, along with an activity on the back, such as a related word-find. New people are coming and look forward to a word of encouragement, a prayer, a devotion to bring home. One lady told us that she has kept her scriptures from day 1.

Transformation: As we prepare to reopen, we are revamping the way things have been done. A social service station will be present in the main dining area for assistance in filling out forms, referring people to area agencies, and other things they may need. We are preparing a new Bible Study "Who God is", run by a local retired clergy. A youth worker is committed to coming once per week to spend time in faith conversations. **Opportunities:** There are opportunities to partner with us in ministry! This may be volunteering certain days in the kitchen, hosting during mealtimes, or manning a table in the social services area to help others. Would you like to come and sing or offer music? Facilitate a Bible study? How about getting involved with some racial reconciliation discussions and a movie? or, it could be partnering financially, or in prayer! They say it takes a village to raise a child - we need the whole community to support and nurture those who come our way. You will be blessed by it. Trainings and poverty simulation workshops will be offered. Join us, partner! You will be blessed.

ASK *After School Kids* PROGRAM CONTINUES



We have had the pleasure to continue to assist in delivering meals to some of our ASK (AFTER SCHOOL KIDS) kids and their families even though there is no school. The kids and families are so appreciative of the few moments we spend with them 3 days/week. Along with the food at least once a week we include some Sunday School booklets, coloring pages and scripture. In addition some of us have been providing age appropriate books for the children as possible. We had a special surprise the week after Easter when one young man (a sixth grader) ran out to ask us if it was OK if he gave us something (safe distancing) and quickly stepped back after he handed us the items, an Easter craft he had made as well as a beautifully colored Easter Cross picture with a hand written "Thank You" for reading with him at the ASK program. He is a wonderful kid who tends to tell tall tales, has an occasional problem with anger management, is reading way below grade level and has told me "you know I'm not a Christian." To which I answered, "maybe not yet, but I can't wait to tell you more about how to become one!!" Unfortunately that exchange took place the last ASK day before the schools closed. These are wonderful kids, we can't hug or spend much time with them for now but we can continue to let them know how much they and their families are loved by God the Father, God the Son and the God Holy Spirit. We can pray for them and look forward to the time when we can again meet as a group and one on one.
