Visitors will have the opportunity to see the ministries of Sojourner Truth as well as what is planned for the House of Hope.

Thanks to Hillside Catering for providing appetizers and drinks. The West Branch school is participating in an Art Contest and their work will be displayed for our enjoyment. Exhibits of STM will be displayed throughout the buildings, offering back stories, photos, interesting facts, special thanks, and offering options to give toward specific needs and goals.

Sojourner House of Hope is an extension ministry planned for women coming out of homelessness. The House program is Christ-based and is geared to deal with the root issues rather than symptoms of homelessness, trading lies that women may have believed for many years with the Truth of who God says they are, His promises, and their value in His eyes. There are also life skills programs required of residents, and we will be partnering with many local agencies. The House of Hope is planned to be short term communal.

Parking will be available at the American Rescue Workers lot located on Elmira Street with shuttle service. Come and learn more! There is no charge, but there will be many opportunities to invest in the program and those to come. The atmosphere will be festive and creative as we do our best to portray what has been done thus far and what is planned to come. TROUBLED BY INADEQUACY?

A few months back I was invited to volunteer in an administrative capacity at Sojourner Truth Ministries. I had served on the Board off and on since the early days. But I left the Board because my hearing (with aides) is difficult to distinguish speech.

Me? "Administrative capacity"? I decided to try it, since I wouldn't be directly involved in conversation with people for the most part, due to my hearing.

The first day Pastor Angelique introduced me to someone by saying, "This is Jerry. He knows *all about* computers"! I nearly fainted: I didn't know whether to scream or run.....!!! The one thing I knew going into this venture was that I am *limited* in computer knowledge. Very limited! I was severely afflicted with feelings of inadequacy.

I quickly learned that, with a little study, I could accomplish what was being asked of me.

I am also limited in creativity. ...working on that!

Angelique is begging for volunteers all the time. Why? Because volunteers come and go. But the bigger reason is that the Board has set some huge goals for ministry. This enterprise that started small is growing into the vision for which it was started. It was not to be a focused on physical needs as much as the spiritual needs of people who wouldn't enter established churches. It was also planned to give small-membership churches an opportunity for outreach they couldn't achieve on their own.

Angelique is a visionary. But she can't accomplish the Spirit-directed goals without more volunteers. If you have been prompted to get on the cutting-edge of significant ministry locally, STM is the place!

Feel inadequate? YOU ARE! If you know the gospel you know that we are all born inadequate. That's what Jesus is for! Whoever coined the phrase "God doesn't call the equipped, He equips the called" is *so* on target. Read Exodus 3:11-12 Jeremiah 1:4-8, Luke 1:29, or Matthew 16:33. Look what they accomplished.

The Call of the Ordinary

Culture cries out, "You are special" because being ordinary is not acceptable. We fall away from things at which we don't excel. We withdraw from competition for fear of losing. We believe our life has to count on a grand scale. We need to leave a legacy that can be measured.

Jesus Christ shows us that an ordinary life is heroic in its own way. Galatians 2:20 declares, "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." While Paul wrote these words, they are our words. Michael Horton notes, "No longer a star in my own movie, I can take my place in this gift exchange. The gifts that I have are not only for my private use, but for me to pass along to others. And the weaknesses I have are important because they make me more dependent on others." We have been consecrated by God to serve Him and to serve others. Remember the Apostles were ordinary men that changed the world as followers of Christ. Isn't that the key for us all? Say yes whenever God calls out to serve, do your best to glorify Him, and don't walk away from tough situations through which God wants you to endure to complete the mission He has prepared for you.

Luke 10:27 summons us to, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and, Love your neighbor as yourself." This is the call to the ordinary life.
