Dinner Table Church

The pews in the sanctuary have been removed and in their place are large, round tables set for a meal. Immediately following a 30-minute service the stained-glass doors are opened to a small adjoining room from which guests serve others a simple buffet-style lunch. People come in early to spend time visiting, observing the volunteers or helping with last minute details. Some who have not volunteered in the past have begun to serve, and others have stepped up in new ways. In October, STM began hosting Dinner Table Church to meet the following needs: offer some "food for the soul" on a consistent, weekly basis, provide for a physical need (a meal), to be intentional about developing community, to be a place and time of fellowship, and to have intentional, spiritual conversations about important and relevant things- all in a nonthreatening, welcoming and inviting space for people who may be unchurched, or de-churched, and those who may not have a church home. The tables are round to encourage conversation. The atmosphere is casual to welcome all. The meals are made and served with love to all who come, regardless if they come for the preceding service or not. Conversation starters are printed for each table to help engage participants to debrief the brief Scriptural message of hope and what it might mean for them. Sometimes we are blessed with live music, and sometimes songs familiar to all are played (such as Journey's 'Open Arms', which was played recently as a prayer song, imagining that Jesus was singing it to each of us personally).

Feedback from participating churches and groups has been overwhelmingly positive, as has been the response from those who come to attend or even volunteer for the service. A report back from Leadership Lycoming called it "a hidden gem of Williamsport". Those who have had opportunity to serve on a Saturday are pleased with more face time and better connections with the sojourners.

The number of lunches served varies weekly from about 45-80, and most groups prepare for 100. Sometimes we have just enough food, and sometimes we get to send some home with folks. There are many openings in the schedule for the year- look at the website https://stmwilliamsport.org to find available dates! * signup is through the website*. Groups typically bring prepared food and serve from crockpots or roasters, but other arrangements can be made if needed. We are flexible! Plan on a 10 am arrival, and plan to stay until about 1:15. After-School Program

By the time you read this, we will have begun serving after school snacks to students and offering supervised programming from 3:30-4:45 on Tuesdays and Wednesdays! Thanks to an anonymous and generous gift, Homework help, life skills through problem-solving theatre, checkers and chess with life lessons, cartoon videos with a Christian message, group games and activities will all be offered! We offer a safe place for kids to be poured into as an alternative to being unsupervised after school. Incorporated into activities are intentional life lessons reminding each child that they are valued simply because of who they are, not because of what they do. Messages of anti-bullying, safety, and tools for empowering such as identifying "tricky people" (manipulative people) and the "uh-oh feeling" (something's not right with what's happening) will be reinforced as we do our part in working to reduce all types of abuse in the after school hours (a prime time for physical and sexual abuse to occur). Each facet of what we do has a purpose, and this is the most practical way we can show the love of Jesus to kids.

Committed volunteers welcome (we will help with all required safety and background clearances). Especially needed are homework helpers! Needed: Veggie tales or Bible times DVD's, reams of printer paper, Boomwhacker set (whole musical scale), local gift cards to meet needs for our helpers, and generous financial gifts of all sizes.

Our Social Services Advocate, Andrea,

works mornings Monday-Friday and helps to find resources, make phone calls, filling out forms for those who cannot read or simply find the process overwhelming. She helps to make appointments with caseworkers, doctors, and other advocates to help people find placement, or find ways to help with a bill, or be a listener or talk sense with discernment. In addition to this, she runs the clearance checks for our volunteers and works with court ordered community service workers. In dealing with the many hardships our sojourners face, she still finds a smile and compassion enough for all. Thank you,
