APPLES

MACOUN APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 Preferred by many over its parent McIntosh, this very high quality apple has firm, white, juicy flesh.



POLLINATE: Mid season blooming. Pollinator required - use any mid, early or late blooming apple.
 Best for fresh eating, cooking, canning and dried.
 Zone 4.



STAYMAN APPLE Semidwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 This heirloom apple has a wonderful sweet-tart flavor. The apples are large and deep red in color.



POLLINATION: Late season blooming. Pollen Sterile - will not pollinate other apples, but it must have another mid or late blooming apple to pollinate it.
 Best for fresh eating, baking and long storage.
 Zone 5.



LIBERTY APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 A cold hardy McIntosh type apple with very good disease resistance.



POLLINATE: Mid season blooming. Pollinator required - use any mid, early or late blooming apple.
 Best for fresh eating, cooking and canning.
 Zone 4.



JONAGOLD APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 The tartness of Jonathan and the sweetness of Golden Delicious combine to make a wonderfully flavored eating apple.



POLLINATE: Mid season blooming. Pollen Sterile - will not pollinate other apples, but it must have another mid or early blooming apple to pollinate it.
 Best for fresh eating and desserts.
 Zone 5.



MUTSU (CRISPIN) APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 From Japan, this apple has a wonderful, sweet, spicy flavor. Matures late season.



POLLINATE: Mid season blooming. Pollen Sterile - will not pollinate other apples, but it must have another mid or early blooming apple to pollinate it.
 Best for fresh eating and baking.
 Zone 4.



HONEYCRISP™ APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica (PP# 7197)
 The name says it all this is regarded as one of the most flavorful new apples. The fruit is very sweet and crunchy.



POLLINATE: Mid season blooming. Pollinator required - use any mid, early or late blooming apple.
 Best for fresh eating and long storage.
 Zone 4.



ROYAL GALA APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 One of the best fresh eating crisp, sweet apples. This variety is a heavy producer and ripens in late summer.



POLLINATE: Mid season blooming. Pollinator required - use any mid, early or late blooming apple.
 Best for fresh eating and salads.
 Zone 5.



GOLDEN DELICIOUS APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 Golden Delicious is still the world's most popular apple, but the flavor is so much better from a homegrown tree! Sweet and spicy and a consistent producer.



POLLINATE: Mid to late season blooming. Self Pollinating. Will provide pollen for any other mid or late apple.
 Best for fresh eating, pies and cooking, canning and freezing.
 Zone 5.



GRANNY SMITH APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 A late season green tart apple, that bears heavy annual crops, bursting with flavor when fully matured.



POLLINATE: Mid to late season blooming. Pollinator required - use any mid or late blooming apple.
 Best for fresh eating, pies and cooking and winter keeping.
 Zone 6.



MCINTOSH APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 This heirloom variety has been around since the early 1800 and is a favorite in northern climates. It is one of the most flavorful apples.



POLLINATE: Early to mid season blooming. Pollinator required - use any mid or early blooming apple.
 Best for fresh eating and baking.
 Zone 4.



CORTLAND APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 Excellent for northern climates, this red, McIntosh-type apple is large, crunchy and tasty. Great in salads because fruit does not turn brown quickly.



POLLINATE: Mid season blooming. Pollinator required - use any mid, early or late blooming apple.
 Best for fresh eating, pies and cooking, canning and winter keeping.
 Zone 4.



RED FUJI APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 From Japan, this large fruit is sweet, late maturing apple is crunchy and keeps very well.



POLLINATE: Mid season blooming. Pollinator required - use any mid, early or late blooming apple.
 Best for fresh eating, desserts and salads.
 Zone 5.



GINGER GOLD® APPLE Semidwarf
Malus domestica
 A yellowish green summer ripening apple. Crisp, mildly tart and great for fresh eating. Multiple season bloomer. Self pollinating.



POLLINATION: Mid to late season bloom. Self Pollinating.
 Great for fresh eating and cooking.
 Zone 5.



RED DELICIOUS APPLE Semidwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 An apple that was named for its main attribute flavor. Delicious is known for its taste, crispness, color and shape.




POLLINATION: Mid season blooming. Pollinator required - use any mid, early or late blooming apple.
 Best for fresh eating, desserts and salads and winter keeping.
 Zone 5.




APRICOT

GOLDCOT APRICOT Dwarf
Prunus armeniaca
 Developed in Michigan, this very cold hardy apricot has a record of producing regular crops of medium to large, delicious fruits.



POLLINATE: Self Pollinating
 Best for fresh eating, jam, canning, cooking and drying.
 Zone 5.



BLUEBERRY

BLUERAY BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum
A very sweet, slightly tart and aromatic blueberry variety that ripens early to mid season. The medium blue fruit is borne in small, tight clusters.



POLLINATION:
Pollinate with another blueberry variety for maximum amount of fruit.

Best for fresh eating.
Zone 4



ANGUSTIFOLIUM BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium angustifolium
This native blueberry produces the small sweet "wild" flavor foragers love. A bonus is the beautiful fall maroon and purple foliage. Mature at 6-24" tall and wide.



POLLINATION:
Pollinate with another lowbush blueberry for maximum fruit.

Best for fresh eating.
Zone 4



CHIPPEWA BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum x Vaccinium angustifolium
This half-high and cold tolerant blueberry produces large sweet fruit that ripens mid-season. It is compact and suitable for container growing. Brilliant red fall foliage.



POLLINATION:
Pollinate with another blueberry variety for maximum amount of fruit.

Fresh eating and baking.
Zone 3.



BLUEJAY BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum
This mid season blueberry variety sports open, loose clusters of medium to large light blue berries. Mild, slightly tart flavor.



POLLINATION:
Pollinate with another blueberry variety for maximum amount of fruit.

Best for desserts.
Zone 5



NORTHBLUE BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum x Vaccinium angustifolium
A very cold hardy half-high variety that produces medium sized fruits that taste like wild blueberries. It ripens mid-season and is a great landscape plant with an upright habit and beautiful burgundy and red fall foliage.



POLLINATION:
Pollinate with another blueberry variety for maximum amount of fruit.

Fresh eating and baking.
Zone 3.



BLUECROP BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum
This blueberry variety has good flavor and quality, medium to large, light blue fruit borne in clusters ripens early mid season. Hardy and more drought tolerant than others.



POLLINATION:
Pollinate with another blueberry variety for maximum amount of fruit.

Best for fresh eating.
Zone 4



PINK LEMONADE BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum
A new variety with three season interest! Pale pink flowers in the spring produce pink blueberries in summer followed by great fall foliage. Mid to late season ripening. Mature height is 5'.



POLLINATION:
Plant two varieties for best fruit production

Fresh eating
Zone 4



PATRIOT BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum
This early ripening variety produces larger berries than other early varieties. The plant is adaptable to many soil types and has some disease resistance.



POLLINATION:
Pollinate with another blueberry variety for maximum amount of fruit.

Great for fresh eating and cooking
Zone 3



POLARIS BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum x Vaccinium angustifolium
Developed in Minnesota for cold winters, this half-high blueberry ripens early. The fruit is medium sized, very sweet and fragrant with red fall foliage.



POLLINATION:
Pollinate with another blueberry variety for maximum amount of fruit.

Fresh eating and baking.
Zone 3.



ELLIOTT BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum
An attractive ornamental shrub which produces late ripening small to medium sized berries with a mild flavor.



POLLINATION:
Pollinate with another blueberry variety for maximum amount of fruit.

Best for fresh eating.
Zone 4



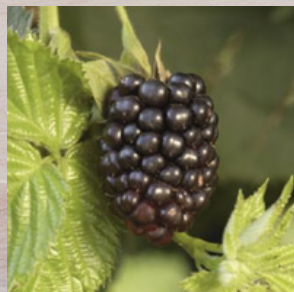

MONTMORENCY CHERRY Semi-dwarf
Prunus cerasus
The absolute standard of all tart cherries. Bright red fruit with yellow flesh. Early and heavy producer.



POLLINATE: Self Pollinating
Best for fresh eating, pies, cooking, canning and freezing.
Zone 5.



BLACKYORK® CHERRY (EASTERN BING) Semi-dwarf
Prunus avium
The same large, dark red black, delicious cherries as Bing, but disease resistant and better suited to Eastern growing conditions. Introduced by Cornell University.



POLLINATE: Pollinator required. Sweet cherry. Must be pollinated by another sweet cherry variety.
Best for fresh eating.
Zone 5.




DANUBET™ CHERRY Semi-dwarf
Prunus cerasus
Medium to large, dark red fruits are sweeter than Montmorency. Very productive.




POLLINATE: Self Pollinating
Best for fresh eating and baking
Zone 4.



WHITEGOLD™ CHERRY Semi-dwarf
Prunus avium
Whitegold sweet cherries are large and yellow with excellent flavor. The tree is disease resistant and the fruit is crack resistant. Introduced by Cornell University.



POLLINATE: Self Pollinating. Sweet Cherry. Will pollinate other sweet cherries.
Best for fresh eating.
Zone 5.

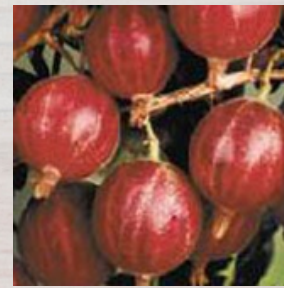

CONCORD SEEDLESS GRAPE

Vitis labrusca 'Concord'
This seedless selection has excellent and distinctive flavor and is the standard of quality for black-black grapes. Vines are vigorous, hardy and productive.

POLLINATION:
Self pollinating.
Best for juice, jelly, wine or fresh eating.
Zone 4

MARQUIS GRAPE

Vitis labrusca 'Marquis'
From Cornell, this seedless white variety grows in large clusters. The fruity flavor is good and rich, and the fruit is versatile.

POLLINATION:
Self pollinating.
Best for fresh eating or wine making.
Zone 5

RELIANCE GRAPE

Vitis labrusca 'Reliance' (PP#5174)
A seedless, juicy, rich-flavored variety with deep-red fruit, whose vigorous vines produce large clusters of these old favorites.

POLLINATION:
Self pollinating.
Best for fresh eating.
Zone 5

VANESSA GRAPE

Vitis labrusca
This blushing red seedless grape is very flavorful! Disease resistant.

POLLINATION:
Self Pollinating
Best for fresh eating and baking.
Zone 5

HONEYBERRY

BLUE MOON™ HONEYBERRY

Lonicera edulis var. kamschatcika
An attractive, spreading shrub with soft, velvety, bright green leaves. It produces fruit which is large and tasty.

POLLINATION:
Pollinate with another Honeyberry variety.
Best for fresh eating or making preserves.
Zone 3

BLUE VELVET™ HONEYBERRY

Lonicera edulis var. kamschatcika
Attractive grayish-green and velvety foliage make this compact, spreading variety unique. Fruit is very large, medium-blue, sweet-tart and flavorful.

POLLINATION:
Pollinate with another Honeyberry variety.
Best for fresh eating or making preserves.
Zone 3

MEADER PERSIMMON

Diospyros virginiana
This American persimmon was selected in New Hampshire because of its superior round orange fruit. The tree is beautiful in the fall as its leaves turn red and yellow. Mature height 25 ft.

POLLINATE: Self Pollinating
Best for fresh eating and baking.
Zone 4

PAWPAW

Asimina triloba
This native American fruit was enjoyed by Lewis and Clark on their trek west. The fruit has a banana like flavor with creamy soft flesh and the tree is very attractive in all seasons. Mature height 12-15 ft.

POLLINATE: Best fruit yield when two or more varieties are planted nearby.
Best for fresh eating.
Zone 5.

SECKEL PEAR Dwarf

Pyrus communis
This small green red European pear prized for its high sugar content. The tree produces large crops when mature.



POLLINATE: Pollinator required. Must be pollinated by another European Pear, except Bartlett.

Best for fresh eating, winter keeping, cooking and canning.

Zone 5.



HOSUI ASIAN PEAR Dwarf

Pyrus pyrifolia
An early season, russet type Asian pear. Large round pears are very sweet, juicy and delicious.



POLLINATE: Self Pollinating. Will pollinate other Asian pears.

Best for fresh eating, good storage and ornamental.

Zone 6.



20TH CENTURY ASIAN PEAR Dwarf

Pyrus pyrifolia
One of the best Asian pears. The flesh is sweet, slightly tart, firm and juicy. Very productive.



POLLINATE: Pollinator required. Must be pollinated by another Asian Pear.

Best for fresh eating and canning.

Zone 6.



COMICE PEAR Dwarf

Pyrus communis
A luscious, rich flavored European dessert pear. The skin color is a beautiful golden yellow with a tinge of red.



POLLINATE: Pollinator required. Must be pollinated by another European Pear.

Best for fresh eating, salads and baking.

Zone 5.



RED BARTLETT PEAR Dwarf

Pyrus communis
Similar in every way to green Bartlett, with a strikingly beautiful red color.



POLLINATE: Pollinator required. Must be pollinated by another European Pear, except Seckel.

Best for fresh eating, cooking, canning and freezing.

Zone 5.



ANJOU PEAR Dwarf

Pyrus communis
These bright green fruits develop a tinge of yellow at maturity. The crisp, white, sweet flesh make this one of the highest quality European pears.



POLLINATE: Pollinator required. Must be pollinated by another European Pear.

Best for fresh eating and winter keeping.

Zone 5.



BARTLETT PEAR Dwarf

Pyrus communis
The most popular European pear variety in the U.S.A. The smooth, luscious flesh is sweet and juicy.



POLLINATE: Pollinator required. Must be pollinated by another European Pear, except Seckel.

Best for fresh eating, cooking and canning.


Zone 5.



PLUM

METHLEY PLUM Semi-dwarf


Prunus salicina
Sometimes called "Sugar Plum", this Japanese style plum has medium sized fruit and is very productive.



POLLINATE: Self Pollinating Japanese plum. Will pollinate other Japanese Plums.


Best for fresh eating and canning.

Zone 5.



SUPERIOR PLUM Semi-dwarf


Prunus domestica
A Japanese-American hybrid from the University of Minnesota is very hardy and a great choice for northern gardens. The late ripening fruit is sweet and juicy with yellow flesh. Clingstone.



POLLINATION: Requires pollination by another Japanese/American plum variety.

Fresh eating.

Zone 4.



PEACH

BLUSHINGSTAR® PEACH Dwarf
Prunus persica (PP# 10,554)
 A firm, high quality, white flesh peach which matures late in the season. Very productive tree.



POLLINATE: Self Pollinating
 Best for fresh eating, shipping and storing.
 Zone 5.




JULY ELBERTA PEACH Dwarf
Prunus persica
 A large, mid-season, freestone peach that is similar to the original Elberta, only matures earlier. Sweet, juicy, yellow flesh.



POLLINATE: Self Pollinating
 Best for fresh eating, canning, cooking and freezing.
 Zone 5.



BELLE OF GEORGIA PEACH Dwarf
Prunus persica
 The queen of white peach varieties, Belle of Georgia matures in late season, has a wonderful aroma and a very sweet taste.



POLLINATE: Self Pollinating
 Best for fresh eating, pies, cooking and canning.
 Zone 5.

RASPBERRY

BRISTOL BLACK RASPBERRY
Rubus idaeus
 This variety produces very large, firm, glossy, jet-black fruit with a rich but mild, sweet flavor. Excellent quality. Canes are upright, sturdy, vigorous, compact and productive.



POLLINATION: Self pollinating.
 Best for fresh eating, desserts, jelly, freezing or canning.
 Zone 4.



JEWEL BLACK RASPBERRY
Rubus sp.
 This summer bearing variety produces large fruit with rich raspberry flavor. Expect large harvests of glossy high quality fruit.



POLLINATION: Self pollinating.
 Best for fresh eating, pies and preserves.
 Zone 5.



ANNE YELLOW RASPBERRY
Rubus idaeus
 An everbearing variety. Large, very sweet flavored, yellow fruit is produced on new canes.



POLLINATION: Self pollinating.
 Best for fresh eating.
 Zone 4.



HERITAGE RED RASPBERRY
Rubus idaeus
 The most popular everbearing variety which produces large, sweet, dark red fruit from mid summer until frost. Bears fruit the first year.



POLLINATION: Self pollinating.
 Best for fresh eating.
 Zone 4.



POLANA RASPBERRY
Rubus idaeus PPAF
 From Poland, this fall variety produces well in areas where early frosts occur. The fruit ripens three weeks earlier than Heritage, and is large, glossy and sweet. The plant is more compact than other raspberries and responds well to heavy fertilization.



POLLINATION: Self Pollinating.
 Best for fresh eating and preserves.
 Zone 3.

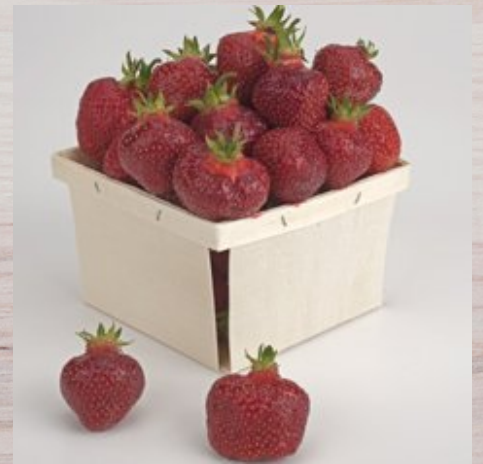
