



BERRY & FRUIT



APPLES

MACOUN APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 Pollinated by many of the parent 50 broods, this sweet high quality apple has firm, white, juicy flesh.



POLLINATE: Mid season
 Blooming. Pollination required on any mid, early or late blooming apple.

Best for fresh eating, cooking, canning and drying.

Zone 4



STAYMAN APPLE Semidwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 This historic apple has a wonderful sweet tart flavor. The apples are large and stay red in color.



POLLINATE: Late season
 Blooming. Pollen fertility will not pollinate other apples, but it must have another mid or late blooming apple to pollinate it.

Best for fresh eating, baking and using for cider.

Zone 3



LIBERTY APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 A mid sized 50 brood type apple with very good disease resistance.



POLLINATE: Mid season
 Blooming. Pollination required on any mid, early or late blooming apple.

Best for fresh eating, cooking and canning.

Zone 4



JONAGOLD APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 The sweetness of Jonathan and the tartness of Golden Delicious combine to make a wonderfully flavored eating apple.



POLLINATE: Mid season
 Blooming. Pollen fertility will not pollinate other apples, but it must have another mid or early blooming apple to pollinate it.

Best for fresh eating and desserts.

Zone 3



MUTSU (CRISPIN) APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 Zone 3 apple, this apple has a wonderful sweet, crisp flavor. Blooms late season.



POLLINATE: Mid season
 Blooming. Pollen fertility will not pollinate other apples, but it must have another mid or early blooming apple to pollinate it.

Best for fresh eating and baking.

Zone 4



HONEYCRISP™ APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica (IPP 7197)
 The new apple is all about crispness in one of the most delicious new apples. The fruit is very sweet and crunchy.



POLLINATE: Mid season
 Blooming. Pollination required on any mid, early or late blooming apple.

Best for fresh eating and long storage.

Zone 4



ROYAL GALA APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 One of the best fresh eating crisp sweet apples. This variety is a heavy producer and ripens in late season.



POLLINATE: Mid season
 Blooming. Pollination required on any mid, early or late blooming apple.

Best for fresh eating and salads.

Zone 3



GOLDEN DELICIOUS APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 Golden Delicious is still the world's most popular apple. But the Zestar! is much better than a traditional sweet, tart and juicy apple.



POLLINATE: Mid to late season
 Blooming. Self Pollinating. Will provide pollen for any other mid or late apple.

Best for fresh eating, pies and cooking, canning and freezing.

Zone 3



GRANNY SMITH APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 A late season green tart apple that bears heavy annual crops, bearing until winter when fully mature.



POLLINATE: Mid to late season
 Blooming. Pollination required on any mid or late blooming apple.

Best for fresh eating, pies and cooking and winter keeping.

Zone 4



MCINTOSH APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 The historic eating tree from around 1800, the early 1800s Zestar! is a favorite in northern climates. It is one of the most beautiful apples.



POLLINATE: Early to mid season
 Blooming. Pollination required on any mid or early blooming apple.

Best for fresh eating and baking.

Zone 4



CORTLAND APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 Bred for northern climates, this mid 50 brood type apple is large, crunchy and tart. Great in salads because they don't brown quickly.



POLLINATE: Mid season
 Blooming. Pollination required on any mid, early or late blooming apple.

Best for fresh eating, pies and cooking, canning and winter keeping.

Zone 4



RED FUJI APPLE Dwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 From Japan, this large tree is sweet. Late maturing apple to maturity and keeps very well.



POLLINATE: Mid season
 Blooming. Pollination required on any mid, early or late blooming apple.

Best for fresh eating, desserts and salads.

Zone 3



GINGER GOLD® APPLE Semidwarf
Malus domestica
 A paleish green summer ripening apple. Crisp, mildly tart and great for fresh eating. Mid-late season bloomer.



POLLINATE: Mid to late season
 Blooming. Self Pollinating. Cripps has been eating and cooking.

Best for fresh eating and cooking.

Zone 3



RED DELICIOUS APPLE Semidwarf
Malus sylvestris var. domestica
 An apple that was named for its main attribute: flavor. Delicious is best for its taste, crispness, color and shape.



POLLINATE: Mid season
 Blooming. Pollination required on any mid, early or late blooming apple.

Best for fresh eating, desserts and salads and winter keeping.

Zone 3



APRICOT

GOLDCOT APRICOT Dwarf
Prunus americana
 Developed in 1883, this very old hardy apricot has several good eating qualities: sweet or medium to large, delicious fruit.



POLLINATE: Self Pollinating

Best for fresh eating, pies, canning, cooking and drying.

Zone 3



BLUEBERRY

BLUERAY BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum

A very sweet, slightly tart and aromatic blueberry variety that ripens well in cool seasons. The medium blue fruit is firm to "soft", tight clusters.



POLLINATION: Pollinate with another blueberry variety for maximum amount of fruit.

Best for fresh eating.

Zone 4



ANGUSTIFOLIUM BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium angustifolium

This variety blueberry produce the small sized "wild blue" berries from a bush to the beautiful fall leaves and purple foliage. Measure at 0.20" tall and wide.



POLLINATION: Pollinate with another bush blueberry for maximum fruit.

Best for fresh eating.

Zone 4



CHIPPEWA BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum + *Vaccinium angustifolium*

The tall light and cold tolerant blueberry produces large sized fruit that ripens mid season. It is compact and suitable for container growing. Berries are full shape.



POLLINATION: Pollinate with another blueberry variety for maximum amount of fruit.

Fresh eating and baking.

Zone 5



BLUEJAY BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum

This seedless blueberry variety ripens late from clusters of medium to large light blue berries. BBS, slightly tart flavor.



POLLINATION: Pollinate with another blueberry variety for maximum amount of fruit.

Best for desserts.

Zone 5



NORTHBLUE BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum + *Vaccinium angustifolium*

A very cold hardy half high variety that produce medium sized fruits that ripen late with blueberries. It grows well season and is a great landscape plant with an upright habit and beautiful burgundy and red fall foliage.



POLLINATION: Pollinate with another blueberry variety for maximum amount of fruit.

Fresh eating and baking.

Zone 5



BLUECROP BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum

This blueberry variety has good flavor and quality, medium to large, light blue fruit that is in clusters ripens early in cool seasons. Heavy and more drought tolerant than others.



POLLINATION: Pollinate with another blueberry variety for maximum amount of fruit.

Best for fresh eating.

Zone 6



PINK LEMONADE BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum

It was named after their unique color! This plant flowers in the spring produce pink blueberries in summer followed by great fall foliage. BBS in late season ripening. Maximum height is 2'.



POLLINATION: These are varieties for best fruit production.

Fresh eating.

Zone 6



PATRIOT BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum

The early ripening variety produces larger berries than other early varieties. The fruit is firm and holds in many soil types and has some disease resistance.



POLLINATION: Pollinate with another blueberry variety for maximum amount of fruit.

Cook for fresh eating and cooking.

Zone 6



POLARIS BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum + *Vaccinium angustifolium*

Developed in Minnesota for cold climates, this half high blueberry ripens early. The fruit is medium sized, very sweet and fragrant with red fall foliage.



POLLINATION: Pollinate with another blueberry variety for maximum amount of fruit.

Fresh eating and baking.

Zone 6



ELLIOTT BLUEBERRY

Vaccinium corymbosum

A cold resistant commercial breed which produces late ripening small to medium sized berries with a soft flavor.



POLLINATION: Pollinate with another blueberry variety for maximum amount of fruit.

Best for fresh eating.

CONCORD SEEDLESS GRAPE

Vitis labrusca 'Concord'
This seedless variety has sweet and distinctive flavor and is the standard of quality for black grapes. These are vigorous, hardy and productive.

POLLINATION: Self pollinating
Best for fresh eating, wine or fresh eating.
Zone 4

MARQUIS GRAPE

Vitis labrusca 'Marquis'
From Cornell, this seedless white variety grows in large clusters. The shiny flower is gold and red, and the fruit is compact.

POLLINATION: Self pollinating
Best for fresh eating or wine making.
Zone 5

RELIANCE GRAPE

Vitis labrusca 'Reliance' (PP95174)
A seedless, early, dark-flavored variety with deep red fruit, which ripens when produce large clusters of these old-fashioned.

POLLINATION: Self pollinating
Best for fresh eating.
Zone 5

VANESSA GRAPE

Vitis labrusca
This blushing red seedless grape is very flavorful. These are sweet.

POLLINATION: Self pollinating
Best for fresh eating and baking.
Zone 5

HONEYBERRY

BLUE MOON™ HONEYBERRY

Lonicera caudata var. kantoensis
An extremely spreading shrub with soft, velvety, bright green leaves. It produces fruit which is large and tasty.

POLLINATION: Pollinate with another Honeyberry variety.
Best for fresh eating or making preserves.
Zone 1

BLUE VELVET™ HONEYBERRY

Lonicera caudata var. kantoensis
An extreme spreading green and velvety shrub make this compact, spreading variety unique. Fruit is very large, medium blue, sweet tart and flavorful.

POLLINATION: Pollinate with another Honeyberry variety.
Best for fresh eating or making preserves.
Zone 1

MEADER PERSIMMON

Diospyros virginiana
The American persimmon was selected as Blue Meader because of its superior sweet orange fruit. The tree is beautiful in the fall as its leaves turn red and yellow. Mature height 20 ft.

POLLINATE: Self Pollinating
Best for fresh eating and baking.
Zone 4

PAWPAW

Asimina triloba
This native American fruit was enjoyed by Lewis and Clark on their west coast. The fruit has a banana like flavor with creamy soft flesh and the tree is very attractive in all seasons. Mature height 12-15 ft.

POLLINATE: Best fruit yield when two or more varieties are planted nearby.
Best for fresh eating.
Zone 5

SECKEL PEAR Dwarf

Pyrus communis
The small green and European pear proved for its high sugar content. The tree produces large crops after maturity.



POLLINATE: Pollinators required. Must be pollinated by another European Pear, except Bartlett.

Best for fresh eating, winter keeping, cooking and canning.

Zone 5



HOSUI ASIAN PEAR Dwarf

Pyrus pyrifolia
An early season, sweet type Asian pear. Large, round, somewhat very sweet, juicy and delicious.



POLLINATE: Self-Pollinating. Will pollinate other Asian pears.

Best for fresh eating, good storage and canning.

Zone 6



20TH CENTURY ASIAN PEAR Dwarf

Pyrus pyrifolia
One of the best Asian pears. The fruit is sweet, slightly tart, crisp and juicy. Very productive.



POLLINATE: Pollinators required. Must be pollinated by another Asian Pear.

Best for fresh eating and canning.

Zone 6



COMICE PEAR Dwarf

Pyrus communis
A late, rich flavored European dessert pear. The skin color is becoming golden yellow with a tinge of red.



POLLINATE: Pollinators required. Must be pollinated by another European Pear.

Best for fresh eating, salads and baking.

Zone 5



RED BARTLETT PEAR Dwarf

Pyrus communis
Similar to many ways to green Bartlett, with a strikingly beautiful red color.



POLLINATE: Pollinators required. Must be pollinated by another European Pear, except Seckel.

Best for fresh eating, cooking, canning and freezing.

Zone 5



ANJOLI PEAR Dwarf

Pyrus communis
This bright green fruit develops an tinge of yellow at maturity. The crisp, juicy, sweet flesh, made delicious with light quality European pears.



POLLINATE: Pollinators required. Must be pollinated by another European Pear.

Best for fresh eating and winter keeping.

Zone 5



BARTLETT PEAR Dwarf

Pyrus communis
The most popular European pear variety in the U.S.A. The smooth, buttery flesh is sweet and juicy.



POLLINATE: Pollinators required. Must be pollinated by another European Pear, except Seckel.

Best for fresh eating, cooking and canning.

Zone 5



PLUM

METHLEY PLUM Semi-dwarf

Prunus salicina
Commonly called "Sugar Plum", this Japanese soft plum has medium sized fruit and is very productive.



POLLINATE: Self-Pollinating. Japanese plums. Will pollinate other Japanese Plums.

Best for fresh eating and canning.

Zone 5



SUPERIOR PLUM Semi-dwarf

Prunus americana
A European-American hybrid from the University of Minnesota is very hardy and a great choice for northern gardens. The late ripening fruit is sweet and juicy with yellow flesh. Chagones.



POLLINATE: Requires pollination by another Japanese American plum variety.

Fresh eating.

Zone 6



PEACH

BLUSHINGSTAR® PEACH Dessert
Prairie gemma PP# 18-2540
 A fine, high quality, white flesh peach which returns late in the season. Very productive.



HOLLIBROOK Self Pollinating
 Best for fresh eating, shipping and canning.
 Zone 5



JULY ELBERTA PEACH Dessert
Prairie gemma
 A large, well known, summer peach that is similar to the original Elberta, but matures earlier. Sweet, juicy, golden flesh.



HOLLIBROOK Self Pollinating
 Best for fresh eating, canning, cooking and freezing.
 Zone 5



BELLE OF GEORGIA PEACH Dessert
Prairie gemma
 The queen of white flesh varieties. Belle of Georgia matures in late season, has a wonderful aroma and a crisp sweet taste.



HOLLIBROOK Self Pollinating
 Best for fresh eating, juicing, cooking and canning.
 Zone 5

BRISTOL BLACK RASPBERRY
Rubus idaeus
 This variety produces very large, fine grained, jet black fruit with a rich, hot wild berry flavor. Excellent quality. Clean, upright, sturdy, vigorous, compact and productive.



HOLLIBROOK Self pollinating
 Best for fresh eating, desserts, jams, freezing or canning.
 Zone 5



JEWEL BLACK RASPBERRY
Rubus idaeus
 This compact bearing variety produces large fruit with rich raspberry flavor. Expect large harvests of glossy high quality fruit.



HOLLIBROOK Self pollinating
 Best for fresh eating, jams and preserves.
 Zone 5



ANNE YELLOW RASPBERRY
Rubus idaeus
 An early bearing variety. Large, very sweet, flavored yellow fruit is produced in one season.



HOLLIBROOK Self pollinating
 Best for fresh eating.
 Zone 4



HERITAGE RED RASPBERRY
Rubus idaeus
 The most popular early bearing variety which produces large, sweet, dark red fruit, dense and punnet-sized fruit. Bears that like the punnet.



HOLLIBROOK Self pollinating
 Best for fresh eating.
 Zone 4



POLANA RASPBERRY
Rubus idaeus PP# 1
 Bears jet black, rich, dark, sweet, produce well in areas where early fruit is needed. The fruit ripens three weeks earlier than Heritage, and is large, glossy and sweet. The plant is more compact than other raspberries and responds well to heavy fertilization.


