

Fun Facts

Dusky dolphins are adaptable feederssometimes feeding close to shore during the day, and at other times moving offshore to feed in deep water at night and returning to shallow waters to rest during the day.


Dusky dolphins are highly acrobatic, and are known for high leaps and antics during feeding and socializing.

Dusky dolphins are limited to the Southern Hemisphere, and are generally found in coastal areas. There are four recognised sub-species in different locations:

- L. o. fitzroyi Fitzroy's dolphin
- L. o. obscurus African dusky dolphin
- L. o. posidonia Peruvian/Chilean dusky dolphin
- L. o. un-named subsp. New Zealand dusky dolphin
