Energy Blues?

Rising energy costs are a common enemy among homeowners. We fight these rising costs by using items like; LED lights, timers, and the newest craze, Solar, but these are only common due to marketing by big box stores, and facebook ads offering huge savings on your energy bill. While they can have a positive impact on reducing your monthly energy bill, they are but a piece of the move to reduced monthly energy consumption.

Quite often, one of the largest consumers of your homes electricity is overlooked for upgrades, and only repaired as needed. Yes, I am referring to your furnace/AC unit. Most of the houses in Timberlake that are 10 years or older should be considering upgrading their units. The technology available today can lead to large monthly savings simply by increasing the Seer ratings of your unit(s). Additionally, variable speed fans now act and control flow as needed vs constant running which leads to savings.

What type of savings can you expect? There are way to many variables to say exactly how much you will save, but according to <u>seerenergysavings.com</u> South Carolinian's would save an average of 30%* on their AC simply by upgrading from a 14 seer to a 20 seer unit. When is electricity kwh the highest? Summer. When do we use the highest amount of kwh? Summer.

We recently upgraded our AC unit from a 14 seer to a 20 seer system. Prior to upgrade, our summer power bills were averaging \$375-425 per month. After upgrade, our bills averaged \$148-168. The monthly savings were considerable! Enough that I was able to pay for my system upgrade in savings in less than 5 years.

The system upgrade cost \$12,000 through Richardson Heating and Air, and we were able to take advantage of 0% interest financing for 5 years. The payment was roughly \$200 per month, which roughly equalled our monthly electricity savings! Its like it was free! In addition, Dominion offers a rebate for upgrading your AC unit of \$400!

If you have not checked your AC/Furnace in awhile, Contact your local heating and air company to see what they can do for you!
