GeoSpecialties is pleased to submit this proposal to the Lauderdale County Highway Department under Statewide Contract (SWC) 191 – Slope Stabilization Services for slide remediation along Chisholm Lake Road, in Ripley, TN. GPS 35.813563, -89.595269.

Guardian Fence and Construction, LLC conducts its geotechnical and slope stabilization operations under the trade name GeoSpecialties. Guardian Fence and Construction, LLC d/b/a GeoSpecialties is the awarded contractor under SWC 191.

This proposal is based on:

- Site reconnaissance by GeoSpecialties
- Site geometry, estimated wall heights, and roadway constraints
- Unit prices established under SWC 191
- GeoSpecialties' experience designing and constructing soil nail and drainage stabilization systems along active roadways

All work will be performed in accordance with SWC 191, applicable TDOT Standard Specifications, and AASHTO / FHWA guidance.

This work shall be performed in accordance with the terms and conditions of TDOT Statewide Contract SWC 191. No additional terms or conditions are proposed.



I. Project Understanding

- Approximate length: **240 linear feet**
- Estimated stabilization height: **approximately 6-10 feet**
- Slope movement impacting the roadway shoulder
- Repair requires internal reinforcement, groundwater relief, and shoulder reconstruction

The location is well-suited for soil nail wall stabilization with shotcrete facing, supplemented by horizontal drains and shoulder build-out where necessary. The proposed stabilization measures are intended to restore long-term global stability, protect the roadway prism, and minimize future maintenance requirements.

II. Proposed Scope of Work

GeoSpecialties proposes to perform the following work under Group 1 (Soil Nailing) and Group 2 (Horizontal Drains) of SWC 191.

General Scope:

- Emergency or scheduled site visit as directed by TDOT.
- Mobilization of soil nail, shotcrete, and drilling equipment.
- Layout and excavation within the proposed wall limits.
- Installation of self-drilling soil nails up to 20 to 30 feet in length.
- Installation of horizontal drains to relieve groundwater pressures.
- Placement of reinforcement and 8-inch nominal shotcrete facing.
- Shoulder build-out using select backfill material.
- Final cleanup and demobilization.
- Trees and existing debris removal is not included as a part of this proposal letter.
- Installation of geotextile and riprap at drainage ditch (uphill) end of the proposed slide limits is not included. This application would be critical to long term performance of the soil nail wall. GeoSpecialties can include this as a part of scope incidental under this proposal.

Construction will be sequenced to maintain roadway safety and coordinated with the Department traffic control operations.

As part of GeoSpecialties' evaluation of the proposed repairs, preliminary slope stability analyses were performed using Slide2 to assess existing conditions and anticipated performance of the proposed stabilization systems. These analyses would be provided for informational and planning purposes only and will be finalized and sealed as part of the engineered design package prepared under SWC 191.

III. Engineering and Warranty

- GeoSpecialties will provide engineered design drawings sealed by a Professional Engineer licensed in the State of Tennessee, as required under SWC 191.
- Designs will meet or exceed the minimum global stability and serviceability requirements

specified in SWC 191 and applicable TDOT criteria. Preliminary analyses indicate that the proposed stabilization systems achieve acceptable global stability under repaired conditions.

- In accordance with SWC 191 Section A.7.c, GeoSpecialties provides a seven (7)-year warranty guaranteeing the stability of the repaired roadway sections.
 - The warranty will be jointly endorsed by GeoSpecialties and the Engineer of Record.

IV. Roles and Responsibilities

GeoSpecialties' scope of work includes labor, tools, equipment, and materials to design and install the soil nail system pursuant to the following conditions:

1. Design and installation of a soil nail and shotcrete wall system.
2. Excavation of the soil nailed wall.
3. Provide a final design package sealed by a Professional Engineer licensed in the State of Tennessee.
4. The initial mobilization includes labor, equipment, and material capable of installing the stabilization system. Any additional mobilization or remobilization required outside of the planned work sequence will be subject to applicable SWC 191 unit pricing.

Owner would be responsible for the following:

1. Provide traffic control, as required.
2. Repaving (if necessary) following GeoSpecialties' slope stabilization work.
3. Installation of guardrail if necessary (following GeoSpecialties' completion of work).
4. Installation of geotextile and riprap as needed in front of soil nail wall.
5. Provide a dump site for excavated materials.
6. Provide all weather working access to GeoSpecialties for material/equipment deliveries, and on-site area for material/equipment storage. Owner to obtain all right of way, licenses, or easements for GeoSpecialties to perform its work.

V. Key Assumptions, Clarifications and Exclusions

The following are additional key assumptions made in the preparation of this proposed scope and fee.

- No off-site waste is assumed.
- No permitting will be required.
- No surveying is included (e.g. layout survey, as-built survey, and wall tolerances as required).
- The cost of a bond premium is not included in the GeoSpecialties' price. If desired by and paid by the Owner, GeoSpecialties will furnish a Payment and Performance Bond at a rate of 2% of the total price.
- Prevailing wages are included in GeoSpecialties' price.
- Quantities are estimates and subject to refinement following site access and final design.
- No rock excavation or blasting is assumed.
- No utility relocation is included.
- Work is assumed to proceed as continuous, unobstructed operations.
- Any work outside SWC 191 line items requires prior TDOT approval.

VI. Anticipated Schedule

GeoSpecialties estimates that the work described above can be completed in a duration of approximately **3-4 weeks**. The approximate delivery schedule below assumes timely delivery of information and review comments from the owner. All construction work is based on a work schedule of Monday through Friday, up to 10 hours per day as weather and daylight permits. GeoSpecialties can mobilize to the site within three days from GeoSpecialties receiving a purchase order and approved design for this work.

VII. Pricing

Our scope of work includes labor, tools, and equipment to perform the work described herein based on the prices listed below. The prices included herein are based and expressly conditioned on continuous unobstructed work beginning the day GeoSpecialties mobilizes on the site. Should the work not proceed as continuous unobstructed work, the price to perform the work may likely increase. We propose to perform the above scope of work via the following fee breakdown. This pricing also assumes work is completed within 12 or more hours of daylight.
