RESOLUTION NO _____09-23-1

DECLARING SEPTEMBER AS "NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS MONTH" IN LAUDERDALE COUNTY

WHEREAS, National Preparedness Month is an observance each September to honor first responders and raise awareness about the importance of preparing for disasters and emergency events; and

WHEREAS, there have been 363 confirmed weather and climate disasters since 1980 that individually cost at least \$1 billion in damages and collectively totaled \$2,593.8 billion; and

WHEREAS, disaster events pose an acute risk to human life where they occur, with some communities facing substantially higher risk due to their geography but none being immune; and

WHEREAS, building local capacity for disaster mitigation will reduce the potential for harm to people and property from future hazard occurrences; and

WHEREAS, the 2023 theme of National Preparedness Month is "Preparing Older Adults for Disasters"; and

WHEREAS, resilience to disasters and emergency events is built upon collective understanding and preparedness through community engagement;

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE PROCLAIMED, THAT the Lauderdale County Commission declares September as National Preparedness Month in Lauderdale County to highlight the critical role of the county in overseeing emergency response and management on behalf of its residents; and
