




St. Vincent & The Grenadines Caribbean Mission April 27th (Saturday) – May 4th (Saturday)

St. Vincent is a mountainous and forested island belonging to the Lesser Antilles chain. The country is relatively noncommercial and is green and fertile with a lush rainforest, mountainous interior, and beautiful black sand volcanic beaches and fishing villages.

For our second year, we have been invited by the Rotary clubs of St. Vincent & the Grenadines to bring medical care to the main island of St Vincent as well as the small island of Bequia (Beck-way).



At the end of the mission we will take a chartered sailboat, The Friendship Rose, through the Grenadines to Tobago Cay, which is one of the most beautiful locations in the Caribbean. Here you can explore the beautiful sandy beach, enjoy included cold beverages, and snorkel with giant sea turtles.

April 27th Saturday Arrival at the brand new Argyle International airport located an hour East of Kingstown. The team will assemble at the Grenadine House. This evening is free to explore the town, relax by the pool, and get to know your team.

April 28th Sunday –The mission begins today after breakfast. We will have our pharmacy party and get organized for the week. After lunch, there will be an optional excursion (TBD). We will have our first organized team dinner tonight in town.

April 29th Monday – All day Medical/Dental Clinics at site #1 on St. Vincent. We will stop tonight for dinner on the water prior to returning to the Grenadine House.

April 30th Tuesday – All day Medical/Dental Clinics at site #2 on St. Vincent. Dinner at the Grenadine House.



May 1st Wednesday – We will leave early this morning to catch the ferry from Kingstown to Port Elizabeth on the island of Bequia. We will be staying at the Gingerbread Hotel located steps from the ocean in the southern part of Port Elizabeth Bay. We will have the afternoon to have lunch, settle into the hotel, and explore the town and hospital, which is walking distance from the hotel.



May 2nd Thursday – Today we will hold an all-day clinic for the 4400 residents of Bequia at the local hospital.

May 3rd Friday – We will have an early start this morning to walk to the pier and board the Friendship Rose schooner. We will sail about 3 hours south, through the Grenadines, to Tobago Cay, a collection of 4 uninhabited islands surrounded by an underwater reef. Breakfast, lunch, and beverages are included during our sail time. Once at Tobago Cay, you will have the opportunity to snorkel with giant sea turtles, a once-in-a-lifetime experience. Upon returning to the hotel, we will have our final team dinner and the mission will conclude.



May 4th Saturday – Conclusion of the mission. Stay in Bequia, take the ferry to St Vincent or another beautiful island, or jump on a small plane to your next destination.
