

EXPLORING CLIMATE JUSTICE CAREERS

Learn how to combine passion and purpose with a green career.

Grade Level: 6-12 | **Duration:** 1-2 class periods

Students Will Be Able To:


- Recognize diverse careers related to climate change and climate justice
- Understand the requirements for pursuing a green career
- Evaluate innovative career paths for addressing climate challenges

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1 ENGAGE:

- 1. Introduce the topic of green careers with the following videos.
 - a. "What Is a Green Job?"
 - b. "Young People Want Green Jobs"
 - c. "Urban Green Jobs"
- 2. Facilitate a discussion to explore students' reactions, perceptions, and interests in different green careers. Ask questions like:
 - a. What makes green jobs unique?
 - b. Do you know anyone with a green job?

2 EXPLORE:

- 1. Let students choose a green career field to research, such as engineering, health care, arts, construction, conservation, etc.
 They can either work individually or in small groups, based on their choice.
- Instruct students to create poster presentations highlighting careers within their chosen field, including how each career addresses climate change, notable individuals in those careers, and examples of local organizations doing work in that career field.

3 EXPLAIN:

- 1. Show "Green Jobs Building for the Future" to explain how green jobs will be important in the labor market in the future.
- 2. Facilitate a mini "career fair" where each group of students displays the posters (either virtual or physical posters) they created about their researched career field.
- 3. Students should check out the different posters to learn more and jot down careers that look interesting to them.



Use the discussion cards to further conversations.

4 ELABORATE:

- 1. Have students research green careers they might be interested in pursuing.
- 2. Direct students to complete the Career Brochure Worksheet to drive their research.



Use the Career Portfolio worksheet to create a career portfolio.

5 EVALUATE:

- 1. Have students use their Career Portfolio worksheet to create a brochure that is visually appealing and contains the worksheet's components.
- 2. Once complete, students will display their brochures in class.

CLOSURE OR EXIT TICKET:

Reflect on this lesson by answering these questions:

- 1. What is one new career path related to climate change or climate justice that you learned about today, and why does it interest you?
- 2. Reflect on the steps you outlined in your Career Portfolio worksheet. Which step do you think will be the most challenging for you, and how do you plan to overcome it?

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Discussion Cards: Use these questions to prompt discussions and encourage students to think critically about climate change and its implications.

How do arts and journalism contribute to addressing climate change?



Why do people pursue climaterelated careers?



Have you thought about a climaterelated career? Why or why not?

What should governments do for green careers and climate change?

How does education affect career choices for climate work?
