Biography of DR. MARC K. WOODSON



Marc K. Woodson is an ordained Seventh-day Adventist minister who has served the Church in various capacities for over 36 years as a campus chaplain, youth pastor, senior pastor, youth director and conference administrator. He graduated from Los Angeles Union SDA School in 1980 and Lynwood Academy in 1984. He holds degrees from Oakwood University, the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary at Andrews University, as well as a doctorate from Fuller Theological Seminary.

In 2018, Dr. Woodson was elected to serve as the president of the Northern California Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, after having served for 11 years as the Conference executive secretary. However, his greatest passion still remains helping the local church become the agent of change and transformation so desperately needed in today's world. This passion has led him to work with many local congregations throughout the United States and Canada on strategic planning, church growth, gift-based ministry implementation and leadership development.

Woodson is married to his best friend, Marlene Rodriguez, who serves as an associate pastor at Gracepoint Adventist Church in Rocklin, CA, and together they are raising "Tahoe"—a lovable Bernese Mountain Dog. Dr. Woodson has a variety of interests, which include reading, all things historical, model building, traveling and exploring Civil War battlefields whenever he gets the opportunity. He has recently written an interpretive biography on the spiritual leadership development of Elder Eric C. Ward, an iconic figure in Adventist history; the book is being published by the Pacific Press and due to come out soon.
