Everyone is Welcome GHS History Remembered

A new football stadium is coming to Greenville High School. The Greenville City Schools are beginning their Phase III Stadium Outdoor Athletic Facilities where the 88-year-old **Harmon Football Field** has stood since 1937. This Phase III will include new bleachers, press box, additional ticket booth, entrance way, fencing, and pavement upgrade on the roadway directly behind the home bleachers.

There will be a developed area for the district cannon display as well as a naming to the new stadium as **Greenville Alumni Stadium** marked on the press box. There are an estimated 2,216 spectator seats on the bleachers on the home side, including 242 bucket seats. There will be approximately 1,219 total seats on the visitor's side. All bleachers will accommodate wheelchair seating.




Demolition is scheduled to begin in mid-to-late March, 2025, with construction to follow. The hope is having the stadium done before the 2025 season, which will begin in August, 2025. The Greenville Board of Education worked with **Dick Brown** GHS 1964, on the naming rights of the stadium as the **Greenville Alumni Stadium** because of his generous donation toward the Phase III Project of \$500,000 over a five-year period. This contribution was greatly appreciated by the school district.

The district will again work with **Oberer Thompson** as the design builder and **Mote and Associates** as the criteria architect during this phase of construction. The total budget for the project, as approved by the **Greenville Board of Education**, is presently \$4,011,268.00.

Traffic flow and parking will be adjusted around the football stadium as soon as the project begins. The school district looks forward to Stage III of the construction beginning. Greenville City Schools appreciated the cooperation of the City of Greenville, Darke County, construction council, and design team for preparation of the preconstruction design on the upcoming stadium bleacher/press box improvement.

"This will be the 'Peoples Stadium' with everyone in our city and school district being able to relate to this as "their" stadium. The facility will be used for many years to come," says Dick Brown. "The last stadium lasted 88 years and now we have the permanent name for its

successor. The new stadium should seat about 3,400, compared to 900 seating capacity for the **Jennings Track Stadium**, which is the next site to the north, with the fieldhouse in between the two. The School District will still need more money to finish the project and, hopefully, many alumni will contribute to this project by giving a donation directly to the Greenville City Schools. We hope to have a plaque with different giving levels being recognized and a welcoming plaza area next to the current main entrance at the southwest corner of the present stadium. We hope to have benches and maybe a small park area at the southwest corner entrance."



We hope to boost community-wide interest in this facility which will be a focal point of the city for decades to come. There are over 22,500 alumni of G.H.S. since 1873 and encompassing the last 150 years. There will be no end to the connection between our city, our school, and now our stadium, well into the future. All G.H.S. graduates become Greenville High School Alumni at Commencement!

Green Wave Pride will continue indefinitely.





Page 4 Longest Standing Girls' Track Record at GHS Has Been Broken

Last year we documented the longest standing Track and Field records at GHS. The boys' record of the long jump by **Herbert "Hip" King,** GHS 1936 Class President, was set in 1935, and is 90 years standing. The 100-yard dash (later converted to the 100-meter dash) record set by **Mel Connor**, GHS 1946, was set in 1946 when he won the State Track meet in this event, has stood 79 years. That record was tied by **Ron Eikenberry,** GHS 1953, in 1953, 72 years ago.

The longest standing girls' track and field record was the high jump, and it was set by **Tanya Fasnacht Jolliffe**, GHS 1984, when she was a freshman in 1981. Her height was 5' 4 1/4" and it was the school record for 43 years. This year, 2024, Addie Klosterman set an MVL record at the MVL meet, and a school record of 5' 6". Last year she set the MVL record at a height of 5' 3". Addie participated in the long jump, triple jump, and some running events freshman year, but specialized only in the high jump her last three years of competition. A high jump of 5' 6" won the State championship at the State Meet this year in OHSAA Division I, but Addie did not qualify for state this year, scoring a 5' even high jump best in the Regionals, nor did she qualify in her other three years. A high jump of 5' 8" height was the highest at the State meet this year and it was done by a smaller school OHSAA student.

Addie has attributed her success to her two coaches, Head Track Coach **Bill Plessinger**, GHS 1980, and **Jake Porter**, GHS current teacher and coach. Mr. Porter was an inspirational coach, and helped her psychologically for "me not to get into my own head" and not put more pressure on herself at the meets. Addie played on the Lady Wave basketball team earlier in her career.

Addie has not attended GHS but has been homeschooled by her mother **Katie Goodpaster Klosterman**, GHS 2004. The school has allowed her to play sports for GHS teams since she does live within the school district. Her parents and grandparents are all GHS graduates. Her Father is **Jesse Klosterman**, GHS 2003, and her grandparents are **Kelly Myers Goodpaster**, GHS 1975, **Ron Goodpaster**, GHS 1975, **Dan Klosterman**, GHS 1972, and **Patty Linder Klosterman**, GHS 1974. She has a younger brother, **Jack**, class of 2028. Her great grandparents are longtime Greenville residents but not GHS grads: **Tom** and **Ida** Klosterman and **Jack** and **Shirley Linder**. Her friends are GHS students in her age class, whom she does see at sporting events.

Addie has been taking classes at Edison State College for the past two years which will help her to obtain a degree from there beginning this fall. Edison will accept homeschooled students with the accomplishment of some set guidelines. All her high school equivalent homework is taken to a local teacher, who evaluates her work and signs off on her work. She has no set plans for a career but will find some direction at college.

THE PREVIOUS RECORD

The previous record of the girl's high jump at GHS was held by **Tanya Fasnacht Jolliffe**, '84, and Tanya was able to attend and watch Addie do her high jumps. Tanya has been working for years in the West Chester/Cincinnati area and is the founder of L.I.T. Wellness Solutions, and is an award-winning health professional, author and speaker. Her company is a health and wellness consulting and coaching company that guides people as they succeed in non-diet nutrition therapy and lifestyle well-being so companies can cultivate a holistic workplace culture that allows their employees to excel and thrive. Tanya has developed a guided journal to a healthier relationship with food and exercise. She is a featured speaker for WomenSpeakers.com

She also leads a youth discipleship program at her church and is a Christian speaker. Tanya set the high jump school record in 1981 three times, breaking the original record of 5' 0" formerly held by **Kelly Anderson**, GHS 1982. Tanya's heights were 5' 2", then 5' 3', then 5' 4", and became the first female from GHS to attend the Ohio State Track and Field Meet. She qualified all four years of high school and placed each year at State. The highest state finish was third place sophomore year. She broke her record one more time Junior year of 5'4 1/4' at the

Salzman Relays and this was also a Salzman Relays record. **Dwight Salzman,** the long-time Wave Track Coach, gave a special award to Tanya, and they had a special connection since her grandfather **Vaughn Westerman,** GHS 1930, was also a track runner for Coach Salzman in high school.

When Tanya graduated, she held four track and field records at GHS: the high jump (5' 4 1/4"), the 100-meter hurdles (15.2 seconds), the 200-meter dash (26.9 seconds), and part of the 4 by 100-meter relay team, with **Dawn Miller,** GHS 1985, **Amy Cox,** GHS 1986, and **Amy Clark,** GHS 1983. She also played volleyball four years and basketball four years, and was a tri-captain (83-84).



Page 31 Preserving the Legacy of the One-Room Schools by Bob Sharp and Jim Sommer, GHS 1962, and edited by Dick Brown, GHS 1964



This Family Circus cartoon evokes many feelings and thoughts to us when we view it. We hope it also does for you. We wonder how many people nowadays realize what it was like to attend a one-room schoolhouse. Our first thought is how did a teacher handle the workload of teaching all 8 grades in one day, every day, under one roof? Well, apparently it was so well organized that every student was absorbed in studying and learning. For example, often the teacher, while teaching one class, would have some older students tutor another class or classes while the remaining students were doing their schoolwork. This arrangement of older students tutoring younger students fostered a learning environment in which younger students grew to respect and appreciate the older students for helping them learn the subject matter. In return, the older students gained a sense of responsibility and achievement for being assigned the task of helping younger students learn.

Another thought is whatever happened to the one-room schoolhouses which once dotted the countryside? Well, we took a full-length map of Darke County and pinpointed each of the 210 locations of these one-room schools. It shows 105 have been torn down, 60 have been converted to residences, and the remaining 45 are still standing. Many of those 45 are in deplorable condition and beyond restoration.

In 1956, the last remaining 12 country schools in Greenville Township were closed, and the students were assigned to the new building known as **Greenville Township Elementary School** and later changed to **Woodland Heights Elementary School**, and located at the corner of State Route 118 and Children's Home-Bradford Road.

A group of **GHS Alumni** are trying to save this piece of Darke County history. This has not been an easy task. In fact, "If it were easy then it would have been done already". We have worked on securing one of those 45 buildings for at least 17 years. Our goals are the following:

- (1) Save at least one building and preserve it as a "working museum" for future generations to see it, sit at a desk, use the chalkboard, and just get a sense of the compact and efficient education process these buildings provided to many generations.
- (2) To restore the building to an operational condition so some elementary students (3rd or 4th Grade) can spend one or more of their class days at the school and experience what their grandparents, great grandparents, etc. experienced.
- (3) Set up a network, an on-going group that will request and accept donated or loaned artifacts, photos, etc. of this era.
- (4) Set up a computer lookup system integrated with an archive of photos of all available class photos. For example, one could enter their grandparent's name and view all the photos we have of him or her. Often this could be the only time they would have seen a photo of them at their young age!

In order to secure grant money and accept "tax deductible" donations for this project, a non-profit corporation was formed by two GHS Class of 1962 members (**Jim Sommer** and **Bob Sharp**) and by **Dick Brown** (GHS Class of 1964). The name of this non-profit organization is the **Darke County Educational History, Inc.** which is also a 501(c)(3). When you are on FaceBook, please search and view our FaceBook Page for more information about us.

NOW for THE BIG NEWS! After years of seeking a donation of one of these remaining schoolhouses, we recently received the generous donation of the former **Greenville Township**, **Joint District #19 schoolhouse** located on the corner of **Hillgrove-Woodington** and **Warvel Roads. School** was held there from 1890 to 1930. It was one of the 23 country schoolhouses once in Greenville Township.

We are in desperate need of volunteers to help us make this all happen. We need all types of volunteers to help us restore the building and grounds like grass cutting, tree cutting, website building, database building, fund raising, artifact collection, etc. **The keyword is HELP!**

Jonathan Edwards, GHS 2012, won six letters with wrestling being his specialty. He was a Four-time Div-II sectional champion. He was an eighth-place finisher at the state meet as a 103-pound freshman. As a 152-pound senior, he was a district champion, a GWOC champion, GWOC North Wrestler of the Year, and a state qualifier, and finished that season with a 44-3 record. He holds the GHS career records for wins with 166, technical falls, and takedowns.

Junior and senior years, he played on the Wave baseball team playing shortstop and pitching. The 2011 team was a regional runner-up in Div-II. Jonathan made baseball second team

GWOC his senior year. He attended Wright State University's Lake Campus in Celina for three years playing baseball there before transferring to the main campus in Fairborn for his senior year. He earned a B.S. degree in Sports Science.

Now, he is currently a regional sales representative for the Cintas Company, and lives in Greenville with his wife **Sydney** and daughter **Myla.** A second daughter is on the way.

Shane Gibson, GHS 2001, was a standout in two sports at GHS, football and track and field. He was a four-time Div-I regional qualifier in the discus throw, and was a district champion as a sophomore and finished sixth place at the state meet as a senior. In his senior year, he was GMVC champion in both the disc and shot put and qualified for the state meet in both. He was named the 2001 Darke County Track Athlete of the Year.

He attended the University of Cincinnati for his freshman year before transferring to Ohio University sophomore year, where he was a member of the Bobcat track team.

He lives in the Columbus area with his wife **Rachel**, five-year old daughter **Emerson**, and two-year old son **Beckham**.

Paige Keller, GHS 2014, excelled for the Lady Wave in both track and gymnastics. She was a four-year member of the track squad and received first team GWOC her senior year in the pole vault. She was a member of the 4x100 relay team that still holds the school record.

Paige was a member of the gymnastics team. It was only a club sport her freshman year and became a varsity sport her final three years at GHS. She was a three-time All-State selection in the vault and uneven parallel bars. She also was the 2013 National YMCA vault champion. She qualified for the state meet in both events and became the 2014 State Champion in vault. She became one of only six GHS athletes to win individual sports titles in school history. Paige was also the 2013 Homecoming Queen.

Following graduation, Paige attended Manchester University in North Manchester, Indiana. She continued her track career and still holds school records in both the indoor and outdoor pole vault. She was a member of the 4x100 and 4x200 relay teams that still hold records at Manchester. She graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education and, later, a Master's Degree in Community Health and Prevention Science. Paige is currently a middle school physical education and health teacher in the Forest Park

School District (north of Cincinnati). She is engaged to
