2014 Hometown Holiday Horse Parade


The kickoff of Greenville's holiday season has become the Hometown Holiday Horse Parade. This year's version was held November 22, 2014, in downtown Greenville. It was the 11th annual parade and has become a tradition and an attraction for the whole Dayton area, Indiana, and beyond. The spectacle of 70+ horse pulled lighted entries brought over 10,000 spectators to the festivities. The parade is hosted by Main Street Greenville and its Director, **Amber Clark Garrett**, GHS 2000.

This year's Grand Marshal was **Jenny Seiler Clark**, GHS 1973, who helped create the event in 2004. Jenny was inspired to create the event in Greenville after witnessing a similar parade in Lebanon, Ohio. "Greenville is my hometown. BILL BOOKER PRESS BOX

This press box at Good Samaritan Stadium at Harmon Field is named after **Bill Booker**, GHS 1953. He was a gentleman who spent countless hours in this press box as an announcer, scorer, timer and statistician. Bill did live broadcast of Green Wave games and wrote many articles for the local media from the press box.

Bill has served as the press box manager for years. He opens and closes the press box. He always makes press box personnel feel welcome and always accommodates them for their needs.

Bill Booker is a man of many talents and a wealth of knowledge about Greenville Athletics and the City of Greenville. This is only a small way to say thanks for everything he has given to the GREEN and WHITE.

A side note: Bill has spent countless hours cutting in lines and

marking the playing surface. He has set up the field for contests as well as putting equipment away after contests.

Bill has spent many hours in the gyms at the Junior and Senior High Schools doing basketball games. He has developed his own history booklet for Wave Football and Basketball as well his own booklet for Lady Wave Basketball and Softball. During the Softball season, he publishes a weekly "Bink" newsletter/ program keeping the fans up-to-date on the team's progress. Yes, our friend Bill Booker is the true historian of Greenville Athletics.

Editor's note: Bill is pictured here receiving his award from Greenville Superintendent Doug Fries (left) and Athletic Director Randy Swisher (right) at Homecoming, October 3. This article was written in October to express the Athletic Department's thoughts about Bill. Bill Booker passed away unexpectedly Nov. 24, 2014, after a short illness. Bill was always involved in local news media, from his days of sports broadcasting for WDRK in its early days in the 1960s to being a writer and editor for the Daily Advocate and the Early Bird publications throughout the years. He wrote weekly columns, historical pieces, sports stories, and became a managing editor. He was author of many books about local history, especially Greenville, and wrote and directed plays for the local Art Guild players. His writings went beyond sports to all types of local history. Bill gave tours of the Broadway businesses and buildings each summer, during which he could identify all the businesses that existed in the buildings on Broadway over the past 60+ years. He also gave detailed tours of the Greenville Union Cemetery, about which he had written much history to tell interested citizens who accompanied him on his walks. His most recent passion was Greenville High School's Girls Softball team, of which Bill has been an integral part of Coach Jerrod Newland's program. Bill was inducted into the GHS Athletic Hall of Fame in 2005 and was the first honoree who was not a player or a coach to receive membership with this membership known as "Special Recognition". He announced basketball games for many years and knew a multitude of statistics about the Wave sports teams. Bill's parents Wallace and Maude Booker owned four groceries in Greenville from the 1920's to 1950's (500 Martin St., 157 N. Broadway, downtown at 334 S. Broadway, and the 117 Sater St. store which became Myron Eikenberry's (GHS 1929) store in later years, and still exists today as Eikenberry's in another location on Sweitzer St.). He was preceded in death by his parents, his wife **Bonnie Speck Booker**, and their son **Jerald Andrew Booker**. Bill is survived by two sons Alan (William) Booker and Philip Booker, who both attended GHS in the late 1970's and who are both retired from the U.S. Army, along with four grandchildren and ten great-grandchildren. Bill's knowledge of history will be sorely missed by all long-time Greenville residents. He is a true icon of the city.

Paige Keller is G.H.S. newest State Champ

The 2014 Ohio High School Athletic Association's individual Gymnastics State Championships were held last March at Hilliard Bradley High School. GHS Senior **Paige Keller** won the Vault in her third state meet, after a fourth place finish as a junior. Her score of 9.75 (out of a 10 perfect score) tied **Alecia Farina** of Brecksville-Broadview Heights H.S. (near Cleveland) for the best score in the competition.

"I couldn't have asked for a better way to end my senior year as a high school gymnast," Keller said. The last GHS sports state champion was **Kevin Leland's** Pole Vault height at the OHSAA Track State meet in 2009. Paige was voted the Green Wave Homecoming Queen five months earlier.



Greenville Alumni Girl Scout Troop #9 is still going strong

Formed as a Brownie Troop in 1946 at East Elementary School, one of the oldest Girl Scout Troops in the country still meets as their birthdates reach five-year intervals. In 2014 the girls turned 75 years of age, marking 68 years since they came together as Brownies in the second grade. They all graduated from G.H.S. in 1957 and have met on the Darke County Fair weekend as they reached their 50th, 55th, 60th, 65th, 70th, and now 75th birthdays. Most of these girls have been in the troop since the beginning, with others joining over the years. Their leaders **Vera North** and **Naomi Beisner** were the glue that held the troop together. Since the passing of their troop leaders, the

girls make it their priority to continue meeting as a group. The only member living in Greenville, **Marilyn Halley Howell**, organizes the luncheons, birthday parties, and shares news with the others. The group continues to give to the Greenville community, this past year making a significant donation to the Greenville Schools Foundation. This Foundation solicits contributions to fund programs in the Greenville Schools which are not covered by School Board appropriations.

The Girl Scout Little House was built in 1941 by **Fred D. Coppock**, founder of American Aggregates Corporation, and he donated the building to the Girl Scout Council in 1965. It served as "home" to over 60,000 girls and their leaders, until the ravages of termites in the original building structure forced closing in 1991. Buckeye Trails opened the doors of the New Little House in 1992, with a dedication, and support from many Greenville individuals, businesses, organizations, and foundations. Troop #9 was honored at the 1992 dedication of this New House.

Mary A. Martin Celebrates 100th Birthday

On August 30, 2014, **Mary A. Powell Martin**, Class of 1932, celebrated her 100th birthday with family, friends, fellow church members of the First Presbyterian Church, fellow co-workers from Fram and many well-wishers, at Greenville's V.F.W. Post #7262.

Mary was one of the original members of the V.F.W. Ladies Auxiliary Post #7262 after World War II and is now the oldest member.

Mary's family, led by son **Richard E. "Dick" Martin**, GHS 1963, organized this celebration to honor her. Her real birthday, August 28, 1914, dates to near the beginning of World War I.

Mary was one of six girls born to Harve L. Powell and Leona Mae Plessinger Powell. Five are G.H.S. graduates: Mouree G. Powell, GHS 1925; The second girl Georgiana Powell was born in 1907 and died ten days later as an infant; Mayble P. Powell Wiebusch, GHS 1927; Helen M. Powell Webber, GHS 1930; Mary, GHS 1932, and Doris A. Powell Spencer, GHS 1933. Her late husband Eugene F. Martin was also a GHS graduate in 1924.

Coach David Hansbarger led Swanton H.S. to 7 League Titles

David W. Hansbarger, GHS 1958, passed away November 18, 2014, at age 74, from a month-long battle with pneumonia, in Maumee, Ohio. He was a physical education teacher and football coach at Swanton High School for 24 years, before retiring in 1996. His coaching record as head football coach was 154-87-5 over those 24 years, winning 7 league championships. In his last season, Coach Hansbarger compiled a 9-2 record winning the Northwest Ohio Athletic League championship and advancing to the playoffs. He was inducted into the Ohio High School Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2002. Swanton is a village of approximately 3,600 population, 20 miles west of downtown Toledo.

In high school he played football and tennis, along with activity in the Reporter's Club, Latin Club and the Winter Musicals. After graduating from GHS, David attended and graduated from Ohio Northern University in 1961. His teaching and coaching career began in Montpelier and Parkway High Schools before moving to Swanton in 1972.

David's grandfather **Ray Hansbarger** and father **Wayne Hansbarger** founded and operated Hansbarger Appliances, first on Broadway until about 1960, then moving to the business' current address on Sweitzer Street. This business operation still exists, but under the different ownership of the McCallister family. He is survived by his mother, **Katherine Ashman Hansbarger**, GHS 1934, sister **Tammy Hansbarger Cargill**, GHS 1961, wife **Ruth Redd Hansbarger**, four children and stepchildren, two grandchildren, and twelve step grandchildren.

Coach Hansbarger had the ultimate honor of having the football stadium in Swanton, Ohio, named after him, the "David W. Hansbarger Stadium". This is where he became the successful and legendary coach of Swanton High School. His visitation and memorial services were held for eight hours on Nov. 22, at the Swanton High School Gymnasium, and was well-attended, showing the respect for him and his impact on that community.

GHS ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE by Alex Warner, '67

The 29th annual Greenville High School Athletic Hall of Fame induction ceremony was held at the Greenville Elks Lodge with a banquet emceed by Ty House, '74, chairman of the HOF committee.

The first of two inductees was David Farmer, class of 1963. A three-year letterman in football, he was a first team Miami Valley League offensive lineman and linebacker, as well as a choice for third team All-Ohio. He still holds the school record with a 98-yard interception return for touchdown against St. Marys. A state qualifier in track, throwing the discus, he held the school record for many years at 146' 10".

Following graduation, he received a football scholarship to Virginia Tech. He was a tri-captain of the Hokies his senior year, as a defensive nose guard, leading Tech to an 8-2-1 record and a berth in the Liberty Bowl. After graduating in 1967 with a mathematics degree, he had a long career in telecommunications, retiring as Vice-President of Field Operations for Sprint. Presently living on Smith Mountain Lake near Union Hall, Virginia, he and his wife Ann have three daughters and nine grandchildren.

The second honoree was T.J. Powers, class of 1998. A first team All-GMVC, first team All-Southwest Ohio, and first team All-Ohio Division II performer as a linebacker and fullback, he led the Wave to the Division II playoffs his junior year and recorded 140 tackles his senior year. Also a standout in baseball, he furthered his education at Ohio University and Wright State.

He returned to Greenville as head football coach of the Green Wave for 5 years as well as serving as athletic director. Currently he heads the Arcanum Trojan football program. He and wife Emily (Pfeiffer, class of '01) reside in Greenville with their two sons.





8 National Championship Teams for G.H.S. Program

The G.H.S. Vocational Department added an automotive class for the 1972-73 school year. This class offered both classroom and laboratory instruction using textbooks and drawings, with the manual work being accomplished in the new auto garage. The first program leader was **Mr. Dick Seiler**, and most of their class work was correcting many problems on student and faculty cars.

The program advanced rapidly after the new Vocational building was built in 1980. Beginning in 1982, the new instructor, **Mr. Jim Anderson**, GHS 1971, became the catalyst in building the program into one of the best of its

kind in the country. Project-based learning began in 1994, with entering into competitions beginning in 1997. Academic Integration ties the automotive learning with other specific classes at GHS. These classes, such as English, science, and math, are designed around the automotive industry, and have been offered to the Auto Tech students through the years. Juniors and Seniors make up the Auto Tech classes today, and everyone participates in Mr. Anderson's expertise in this area and the students' hard work have prepared them for the national competitions. Their first National Award came in Kansas City in 2001, winning National 1st place. Other first place National finishes were in 2002, 2003, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, and 2009. The 2004 project was good for National 3rd place.

Students from this program are employable. Six did internships at local work sites over this past summer and are continuing with early placement through the school year. Graduates use their skills from this class and work at many local car shops. 45% of the graduates will be placed in an associated job. Many students continue their education at the community college level, with many earning an Associate's Degree in Automotive Science. Students are readied for the National Automotive Technicians Education Foundation (NATEF) test to become certified.

Jim Anderson has returned from a few years of retirement to develop this year's project "Fueling Your Knowledge". It is a study of the flow of crude oil extraction, pipelines all over the country, refiners, truck distribution, into the finished product. Hopefully this summer, the GHS Auto Tech program might bring home a 9th National Championship.
