Marling Band Shell Update

After the demolition of the old **Marling Band Shell** which was built in 1934, the new and improved structure was recently completed. It has structural and electrical upgrades, new vinyl siding, public restrooms attached, and fencing/screening to keep vandals out when not in use. The original building had deteriorated through the years. The first scheduled event will be the Municipal Band's Fourth of July concert this summer. It is available to rent on open dates for outdoor concerts or other private events. Over \$150,000 was supplied by public donations, both individuals and businesses. The City of Greenville support and an Ohio Department of Natural Resources grant provided enough to get the project to the finish line. Greenville's City Park has had many improvements in the past year or two and all of this has been spearheaded by local citizens. If you haven't seen the "New Look City Park", you should make it a point to do so.



Searching for Greene Ville By Mara Jekabsons Cox, GHS 1959

Because my classmate is humble, wants to give credit to others, and not take the spotlight himself, I write this to tell what he has done.

Two Drawings of Legion Buttons

For about 25 years, he has been searching for the military camp at Greene Ville. He, along with archaeologist **To-ny DeRegnaucourt** and many others have dug throughout the area, with given permission. Their goal was to find remnants of **General Anthony Wayne's** era at the camp here. Along with the other diggers, they measured, walked, figured calculations, compared old records, surveys, old maps, and read first person accounts from that time. They discovered misplaced original maps and plans in local and out-of-state museums.

He had sparks of ideas in his sleep. One time at 2:30 am, I was awakened with, "I know where Blockhouse #8 is!" So later he and Tony, with a measuring wheel in hand and other ideas, went to work to locate their find. They presumed, by measuring, that part of the old military camp Greene Ville corner had been taken down to be used as landfill for the area where the railroad trestle was being built over Mud Creek. This is near where Mud Creek enters Greenville Creek at the Shrader Tire building (or the old Nestles dairy products plant) on Route 502, Winchester Pike, at the west edge of current Greenville.


The main camp inside the protective Picket (wall) covered 50 acres and contained a citadel constructed to be the last line of defense. Eight exterior redoubts (small military fortification buildings) containing very large blockhouses were built by Wayne's Legion outside the camp walls, and these were the first line of defense

against possible attackers. The fort, which had been built by the Legion, only last-

ed four years (1792 to 1796) and was abandoned after that.

They also had digs in a bean field across Mud Creek at the Shawnee Prairie just south of Route 502 to find where the exact location of Blockhouse #8 could be. They found the precise spot!

In many of the older and more recent digs they found uniform buttons. With two other people and their helpers, they kept finding, sorting, cleaning, typing their findings and classifying the buttons they found on private property here and in Fort Jefferson outside the park on private property. They located more findings at Loramie's Station and where Fort Loramie was. With over 1,200 buttons found, they felt they had enough information on the buttons to propose and to clarify as to which button was actually the Wayne's Legion button and which were the other General's buttons.

The result is a book my classmate, **Dr. David M. Cox**, GHS 1959, wrote and had published in 2017. The book is well illustrated with photos and drawings and describes the method used to retrieve the buttons from the rocks and debris surrounding them. All details about their findings are included in the book, *A Gathering of Eagles*, which is available at the Garst Museum for \$12.

2018 Athletic Hall of Fame

The GHS Athletic Hall of Fame has expanded to 103 members with the addition of three very deserving athletes from Greenville's past. The 32nd Annual Induction Ceremony took place January 13, 2018, at the Methodist Church Fellowship Hall, with further recognition between boys' games that evening in front of a full house.

Lisa Brinley Beiting, GHS 2007, was the winner of 10 varsity letters, and she participated in volleyball, softball, and basketball for the Lady Wave. A 4-years starter in volleyball, Lisa holds school records for most aces in a season (59) and career (142), most digs in a season (314) and career (918), and most assists, a season high (618) and career (1,748). Of the 10 posted all-time volleyball GHS records, Lisa still holds 6 of these records, more than 10 years after her playing days.



Lisa was also a 4-year starter in softball with more than 100 hits and runs scored for her career. An outstanding defensive shortstop, she was an integral part of the 2007 State Division II championship team, leading the team with 35 sacrifice bunts. Lisa was a defensive stalwart for the Lady Wave basketball team, tallying 243 career points.

After graduation. She earned a Bachelor's Degree in Nursing from the University of Cincinnati and has been a practicing nurse for 7 years. She resides in Independence, Kentucky, with her husband **Josh Beiting** and their 2 year old daughter **Madison.**

Justine Shilt, GHS 2007, was a 3-sport athlete for GHS, earning 12 varsity letters and helping lead the Lady Wave to the 2007 State Division II softball championship her senior year. As, possibly the best lead-off batter in Wave history, Justine holds records for single season and career hits, career runs scored, and career batting average.

Also a 4-year starter in basketball, she holds the Lady Wave career assists record of 432 and scored 451 points, while pacing the team to a 54-35 record. Her 4 years of varsity golf saw the Wave set team records of low team average for both 9 and 18 holes.

After graduation, she furthered her education and softball career at Wright State University. She was a first team Horizon League selection, Horizon League All-Tournament honoree, and ranks first in homeruns, second in career RBIs, and fifth in hits for her career. Justine currently resides in Greenville, is employed by a medical company in Dayton, and assists with the Lady Wave softball program.

Ryan Winner, GHS 2002, was a multi-letter winner in football, basketball, and track while at GHS. He played tight end on offense and set a school record for a single game with 7 receptions for 180 yards against West Carrollton. He played linebacker and defensive end on defense, while garnering All-GWOC honors both his junior and senior years. He also was a 3-year starter in basketball for the Green Wave, and threw both the shot and discus for the Wave track team.

Ryan enrolled at the University of Dayton following graduation and played 4 years of football under the legendary UD coach **Mike Kelley**. He started at offensive tackle 33 straight games for teams that compiled a record of 36-7 and was team captain his senior year. An honorable mention All-American in NCAA Division 1-AA his junior year, he was also first team Pioneer League both junior and senior years. His senior year he was named first team All-American and Offensive Lineman of the Year in Division 1-AA Mid-Major.

Since graduating with a Bachelor's Degree in Communications Management, he is employed as a sales manager for Crown Lift Trucks and resides in Dublin, Ohio, with wife **Kelly Winner**, daughter **Libby**, and the family is expecting a son.


