Page 2 Kenna Jenkinson Becomes the Lady Wave's Top All-Time Golfer

Senior **Kenna Jenkinson**, GHS 2023, holds the Lady Green Wave Golf individual records and has held them since the first month of her freshman year, before she began classes her freshman year. In the opening week of 2019, she broke the 9-hole record by shooting a 34, which broke the record of 37 strokes set by **Ashlee Hetzler**, GHS 2009, and **Kalie Sanders**, GHS 2008. She broke **Justin Shilt**, GHS 2007, record for 18 holes, by shooting a 76 which was three strokes better than the old record. She has played in the Ohio State High School Golf Tournament.

During her career at GHS, she bettered both of those record scores. Her 9-hole record is now 33, and her 18-hole low score is 69.

Her high school career ended this past October at Springboro's Heatherwood Golf Course in OHSAA District play. At the conclusion to her play, her Coach **Tracy Hanes.** GHS 1979, stated, "I am very proud of Kenna and the way she handled herself today. Kenna kept her mental toughness and continued to work hard. Kenna worked hard all four years and has been an inspiration to the other team members."

Her season's low 9-hole average was 37.22, and was part of the Lady Wave team that set a low team score for 18 holes of 343. She was far ahead of all other MVL golfers. Kenna >>> Kenna holds every Lady Wave golf Record, and was known as the "golf girl".

She started playing golf at age 13 realizing it would be a sport she would like to pursue, and the rest is history.

of **Bob Brandon**, GHS 1965.

at GHS. Her freshman year season average was 40.65, sophomore year was 38.00, junior year was 38,24, and senior year 37.22. She led the conference in scoring all four years. Kenna had a

Page 3 private swing coach **Tim Lambert**, and a private short game coach **Brad Smith** while in high school.

Just before Thanksgiving, 2022, Kenna signed with the University of Cincinnati to play NCAA Division I golf for the Lady Bearcats while continuing her education.

"I couldn't have done it without my family, my big support system," Jenkinson said. "They come to almost all of my matches." College golf was not a real consideration early in her high school career until a golf trip to Florida had college coaches taking notice of Kenna's stellar play. She then went to a college showcase in Florida and impressed many coaches.

Kenna will complete her GHS senior year in the classroom at the end of the mid-year semester, and will spend the following four months working on her golf game in Florida, from mid-January to mid-May.



She will be staying with family friends, the **Scott Martin** family in Tampa. Scott was GHS Class of 1996. Kenna has become a friend of Scott's neighbor who is on the ladies' pro golf tour. Her family won't be able to visit her so she will dedicate herself to playing golf every day at the nearby **Carrollwood Country Club**, which is about 5 miles north of downtown Tampa. This is a private club with 27 holes of Champion Ultradwarf greens and has a tour quality practice facility, tennis courts, Olympic sized swimming pool, and workout center. Carrollwood is into helping Junior golfers and offers no fees owed by participants, or small fee amounts owed, to individuals who qualify. They are encouraging more to strive for entering the pro golf tour.

"I want to be able to travel with the team my freshman year at U.C.," Jenkinson said of her next year's goals. "I believe if I work very hard in Florida for four months over this winter and train my butt off, then I believe I can crack the lineup and travel with the team." The University of Cincinnati ladies golf team is NCAA Division I and has 11 members. From last year's team, six are out and will not return, one graduated, and there are seven new spots to fill. She has been shooting an average of 74 or 75 for 18 holes in her recent high school golf career and will have to do 76 to make the U.C. team. The college courses are a little longer than high school, so it is not a sure thing that she can improve this much more. She knew that the existing players at U.C. are a little better than Kenna was going into her Florida workouts. She picked U.C. because she wants to be able to play nearby to her tight-knit family and nearby friends.

Kenna's advice to young golf enthusiasts, "Stick with it and keep a positive mindset because the mindset is the main part of the game."

GHS' All Time Greatest Track Duo

With the passing of the last of the two Greatest GHS Track alumni this past year, it is good to look back at the all-time historic records set by these two older and great track performers. Both were State Champions. Other GHS track participants have won state titles but no records have stood as long as these two have accomplished. **Mel Conner**, GHS 1946, (June 3, 1928-October 23, 2021, at age 93) set two GHS track records that still stand, <u>76 years after they were set</u>. **Herbert "Hip" King,** GHS 1936, (January 3, 1917—June 27, 2014, at age 97) was Greenville's first State Champion and he set a track record that still stands <u>87 years after he set it</u>. Both were charter members of the first GHS Athletic Hall of Fame, which started in 1987.

In 1947, then the legendary head Track coach **Dwight Salzman's** handwritten "GHS Track and Field Records" included 14 events, and three of these records still hold today, 76 years later. This has to be very uncommon since younger, stronger and faster newcomers knock these track times down to new records every year. Salzman developed these two tracksters to be their best.

Herbert "Hip" King, who was President of his Senior Class of 1936. He won the first decathlon at GHS in 1935, proving that he could perform at a high level in many track disciplines. In 1935 track meet in Piqua, Hip set a record in the broad jump of 22 feet, 2.5 inches. No one at GHS has matched or beaten this record in 87 years. He won first place in the 1936 State track meet with a record time in the 120-yard high hurdles, third place in the State meet in the 100-yard dash, and fourth place in the State meet 220-low hurdles.

In 1936, the premier track runner in the world was **Jesse Owens**, who starred at Ohio State University and won gold medals in the 1936 Berlin, Germany, Olympics. He was a high school star at Cleveland East Tech High School, was the best in the world, but none of his records are the best at his home high school. Years ago, Hip had made a trip to Cleveland just to research Jesse's statistics and found these results.

The **Hip King Award** was later established to be awarded to the top track athlete in Darke County annually. During his working career, Hip managed the cabinet shop for 14 years at the

Greenville Lumber Company and later retired as a sales representative for Sanco Products of Greenville, where he worked for 30 years. Hip told me once why the Class of 1936 was the largest graduating class ever at GHS (163) until 1960, when there were 168 grads. The class of 1936 students were mostly born in 1917 and 1918, and that was when World War I ended. (*Editor's note:* A similar occurrence happened in 1964 and 1965 when the graduating numbers ran up to all-time highs,196 and 266, just 18 years after World War II ended).

Hip married **June Cashman**, GHS 1940, and their children graduated from GHS, **Pam King Brand**, GHS 1965, and **Jim King**, GHS 1968. Hip was an avid sportsman throughout his life.

Mel Conner became the next GHS track State Champion, at the 1946 State Track and Field Championships at The Ohio State University stadium. Mel, who had two nicknames, "The Greenville Bullet" and "The Fastest Man in Darke County",


set the record for the 100-yard dash at 9.9 seconds in the state speed heat qualifying round, and matched this number in the state finals. Mel won the State title by two feet in front of Mr. Bannister from Willoughby, Ohio, High School. This record still holds at GHS after 76 years, and was tied by Ron Eikenberry, GHS 1952, in 1952. The 100-yard dash has been replaced by the 100-meter dash, with all times being converted to the metric distances. Therefore 10.8 seconds in the 100-meter dash is equivalent to 9.9 seconds in the 100-yard dash. Mel also has a second GHS track record which has never been beaten in 76 years, This record is the 220-yard dash which he ran in 21.6 seconds. This converts to 21.5 seconds for the 200-meter dash.

Mel apparently won the State meet in 1946 in the 220-yard dash defeating **Dennis Day** of Toledo DeVilbiss High School, who was a runner that Mel had beaten before. The field judge who was supposed to pick the first place position, picked Mel as he came across the finish line, while the field judge picking second place picked Day. There was no *Page 7*







dispute between these two officials, and the results of the race were officially announced and awards were made according to this decision. After about 20 minutes, a reversal of this decision was made by assistant officials sitting in the stands, and over the protest of the two original field judges. Assistant judges in the stands normally were called in when the field judges disagreed. "This is certainly contrary to justice and good sportsmanship" was written in the *Daily Advocate*. They also changed the winning time from 22.0 seconds to 21.9 seconds. Without the sophisticated cameras and timing equipment that is available in today's world, little could be done about this injustice. Coach Salzman filed a protest about this "shady decision", but to no avail. A probable cause for this wrong decision to be flipped was that Dennis Day had signed to come to Ohio State University to run track, and a State Champion would look very good for OSU to have on their roster. If Mel had been credited with both the 100-yard dash and the 220-yard dash wins at the State Championships, which he deserved, he would have been the first track runner to accomplish this since **Jesse Owens** in the early 1930s. (Editor's note: much of this information was from the Daily Advocate, May 27, 1946).

During his working career, Mel spent time as a car salesman for Ernie Myers Ford, working for Tait Manufacturing in Dayton, and most of his career was working as a mechanic for Excell-O/ Cadillac Gage in Greenville. He was married to **Shirley Mullenix** and had four children who are GHS alumni, **Christopher Conner**, GHS 1974, **Kimberly Conner Whalen**, GHS 1975, **Stacey Conner Baker**, GHS 1977, and **Kelly Conner Stump**, GHS 1978. Mel enjoyed golfing and bowling.

Much of the track runners practiced running around the block of the High School, Memorial Hall, and Library immediately after school. Mel said Salz would look out the upper floor windows of the High School building facing West Fifth Street, and yell at his runners to encourage them to go faster, in not the kindest words. Mel always admired his coach, so much that he bought his family's house on the same city block where the Salzmans lived (Mel's home on Wayne Avenue across from South School, and the Salzmans resided on Sater Street in the first block west of South School. Both lived in their houses until they passed away.

There might be an interest in what the next longest standing boys track record is. It is almost 50 years old and was set in 1973. It was the relay team of the 1,600-meter race (approximately one mile) at the blistering pace of 3 minutes, 24.7 seconds. They were lightning fast. Sadly, only **Greg Wilson**, GHS 1975, survives. Other speedsters on this relay team were **Lewis Hopsecker**, GHS 1975, **Mike Fields**, GHS 1973, and **Mike Rhodes**, GHS 1973.

We don't have any pictures of this relay team. The Track coach that successful year was **Terry Barnett**, and he was blessed with superior talent.



The longest standing track record for the girls was the 1981 High Jump record of 5' 5.25" set by **Tanya Fasnacht Jolliffe**, GHS 1984. **Amy Petersime**, GHS 1990, set four girls' records in 1989 and 1990 for 100 meter hurdles, and 300 meter lows, and 100 and 200 meter dashes, and all these records still hold.

Tom Birt, GHS 1976, brought to our attention another statue like the one at the Greenville City Building. This one is at the Mason County Court House in Maysville, Kentucky, and appears to be created from the same mold as the one in Greenville at our City Building and the one at Southern Illinois University.

We wonder how many more of these antiques exist.

Page 19 37th Annual GHS Athletic Hall Of Fame Ceremony

Saturday January 7, 2023, was the date of the latest **Athletic Hall of Fame** banquet and induction ceremony, held at the Greenville K-8 building. Later that evening introduction and presentation of plaques to the new inductees was held prior to the varsity boys basketball game versus Versailles. Three new members were added to the roll of past honorees, bringing total membership in the Hall of Fame to 122 since its 1987 origin.

The first inductee recognized, from the Class of 2009, was **Austin List.** A multi-letter winner, he excelled in soccer and football in addition to playing baseball at a time when Greenville had no league affiliation. Kicking on Friday nights for the Wave football team, he scored 73 points with nine field goals for his career and was selected Second team D-II All-Southwest Ohio as well as honorable mention D-II All-Ohio as a senior. Austin was truly outstanding in soccer and still holds school records with 24 assists in a season, career assists with 46, and is tied for second with 19 goals in a season. He led all of Ohio in D-I with those 24 assists his senior year as his team posted a school record 13 wins.

After leaving GHS he played and lettered four years in soccer at Wright State University, leading the Raiders to the Horizon League finals as a junior. Graduating in 2013 with a Bachelor's Degree in Sports Medicine he resides in Miamisburg, Ohio with his wife **Cassie** and sons **Rhett**, 4, and **Beckett**, 2. He is currently employed by Kettering Health Sports Medicine in addition to being a commissioned police officer and tactical medic for several tactical units in Montgomery County.

The second honoree, from the Class of 2012, was **Kelly Martin**. A four-year letter winner for the Lady Wave softball team, she was an outstanding shortstop and holds the school record for most runs scored in a career with 179 and is second all-time with 192 hits. More importantly she was an integral part of teams that posted 112 wins, made the state Final Four in 2010, and were state D-II runner-ups in 2012. Chosen second-team All-Ohio her senior year she was also first-team Greater Western Ohio Conference both her junior and senior year seasons in addition to All-Southwest Ohio honors for three years.

After high school, Kelly was a key player for Muskingum University, leading the Lady Muskies to the 2014 Ohio Athletic Conference crown and regional D-III runner-up honors. She was recognized as First team all-conference her junior year and Second team as a senior in addition to being named the Muskingum Senior Female Athlete of the Year. Graduating with a degree in Mathematics, she resides in Greenville and is currently the payroll administrator for the regional chain of Scott Family McDonalds restaurants.

The third inductee, from the Class of 2006, was **Taryn Winner**. A two-year letterman in football, he played on the offensive line, was a defensive linebacker, and was selected First team Mid-Miami League as a senior. It was in track and field where he truly excelled, earning three letters and being honored with both GWOC and MML selections. He qualified for the State D-I track meet as a junior and senior in the discus throw, finishing fourth place his senior year. He still holds the GHS record with a throw of 167'4" and was named All-Ohio by the Ohio Association of Track and Field Coaches.

He played football at Wittenberg. Following graduation, he obtained a Bachelor's Degree from Wittenberg University in 2010 and a PhD in Analytical Chemistry from Miami University in 2015. He currently is a senior manager in analytical chemistry for RJ Reynolds and resides in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, with his wife **Cassie** and two-year-old daughter **Josephine**.




