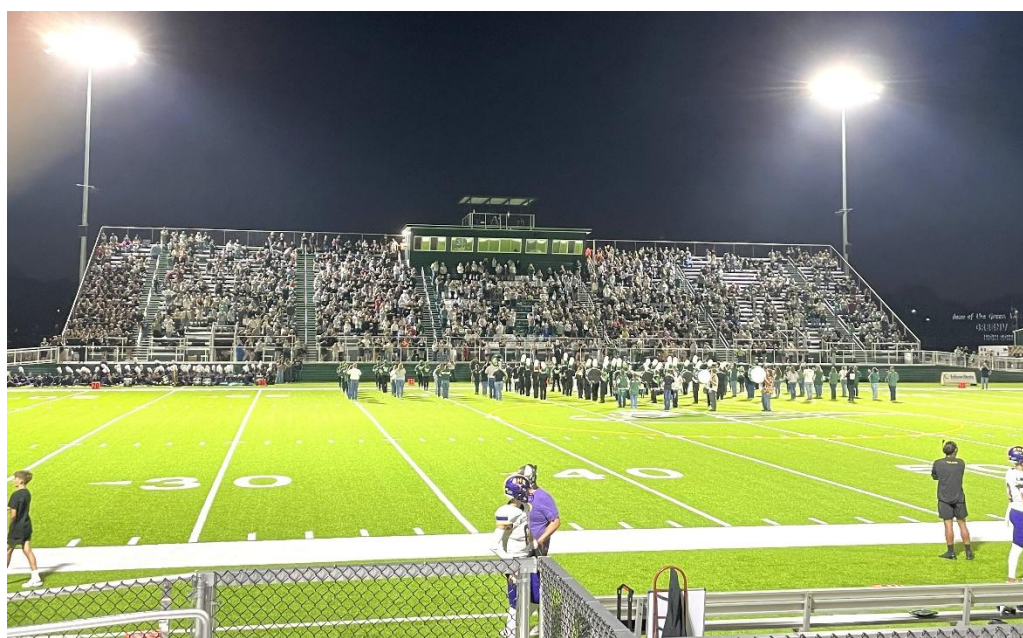

Melinda Menke Hofstetter is a Dayton Daily News Community Gem

Melinda Menke Hofstetter GHS 1959, has always had a love of music performance and teaching that began in 1948 when she was seven years old. At age seven all she wanted for Christmas was a violin, which her parents, **Bernard “Barney” Menke** GHS 1928 and **Winifred “Wynn” Parkinson Menke** (from Columbus) made it happen. Her mother taught high school Latin and her father was a salesman and a manufacturing agent. They were outstanding and contributing citizens of Greenville during the 1940s through 1970s. Her brother **Peter Menke**, class of 1952, has been a long-time pastor in the Greenville area.

At GHS, Melinda was a member of the A Capella Choir, GAA, TCC, Reporter’s Club, Latin Club, musicals, music contests each year. She later earned a degree in musical performance at Miami University. She taught music (strings) at Fairborn HS but most of her career was at the Dayton Public Schools, and at several elementary schools, for 27 years. She then taught violin in her home for several years and has taught hundreds of individuals through the years. She played in the Dayton Philharmonic Orchestra and later the Middletown Symphony Orchestra.

She attends the Shiloh Church UCC in northwest Dayton. After COVID-19 struck in 2020 and in-person church services were stopped, Melinda began a new way of spreading the word of the Lord. She began weekly phone calls to about a dozen people each Sunday and played twenty minutes of music and conversation. She would play two or three hymns on each phone call, and this continues to today.

Melinda was nominated to become one of the *Dayton Daily News* “Community Gems” on June 1, 2025, by her friend, **Jeanette Funk Patton** GHS 1954, who lives in Brookville now. Melinda lives in Butler Township.

Science in Library Science from Catholic University in Washington, D.C. She worked in the **President Jimmy Carter** White House from 1977 to 1980, the Library of Congress Kluge Center, and for decades at the *Washington Post* newspaper. She worked with the Post publisher, **Catherine Graham** and helped her write an auto-biography of Mrs. Graham. She had her own literary journal, "Bearing Books". She loved knitting, poetry, photography, her family, and corresponding with friends. She lived some of her later years in Utah where her son works. She is survived by her husband **Eric Goldman**, and her children, **Will Goldman** and **Anna Goldman**, and her brothers, **David Small** GHS 1964 (and wife **Pam**) and **Dan Small** GHS 1968 (and wife **Teri**). Ev's parents were **Bob** and **Betty Small**.

Susan "Susi" Harless Halley (1948-2026) passed away January 4, 2026, at age 77. She left GHS her junior year at a time when pregnant students were not allowed to continue schooling. She finished high school at Springfield Catholic. She received an Associate's degree from Edison State Community College, a Bachelor of Arts and Masters of Art in Organizational Management from Bluffton University, and a Master of Arts in Vedic Science and a Master of Science in Finance from Maharishi International University (MIU of Fairfield, Iowa). She was beginning a PhD program at MIU this past fall. She studied with **Maharishi Mahesh Yogi** and became a certified Transcendental Meditation Teacher. She worked in the Investment business field, in the marketing program for the Brethren Retirement Community, was Director of the Oakley House Assisted Living, before serving the Greenville Public Library for over two decades. She started at the Library in 2003 and advanced to the Assistant Director in 2005 under long time Director **John Vehre**. She led the campaign that led to the 2008 expansion project. Upon Vehre's retirement, Susi became Director of the Library in 2019. She enjoyed writing, sewing, knitting, and crocheting. She is survived by her children **Connie Halley Vaughn** (of Cincinnati), **Sylvia Halley DeRieux** (GHS 1987, and husband **Jeff** of Eugene, Oregon), **Shelah Halley Miller** (GHS 1990, and husband **Joe** of Tipp City), **Sarah Halley-Murray** (GHS 1992, and husband **Colin** of London, England), **Cynthia Halley Rutherford** (GHS 1995, and husband **Keith** of Powell, Ohio), (**Richard**) **Nathan Halley** (GHS 1985, and wife **Mav Carrasquilla** of Fairfield, Iowa), **John Halley** (GHS 1988, of Greenville), and **Michael Halley** (GHS 1993, and wife Sothavy Shreck of Fairfield, Iowa). Susi's husband of 60+ years **Richard Halley** GHS 1964, died this past September. Susi also is survived by sisters **Rebecca Harless Rosen** and **Barbara Harless Gotshall**, and brothers **John Harless** and **Jimmy Harless**. Susi's parents were **Tom Harless** GHS 1945, and **Hazel Harless**, who moved to Dayton in the mid-1960s.

All three of these brilliant women graduates of GHS were lifelong learners, very family oriented, quite accomplished, and kind people. They were all friends of each other. They represent some of the best alumni in GHS history, and their contributions to this world touched many lives and are too many to mention.

GREENVILLE PUBLIC LIBRARY (notes by Eugene Phelps, GHS History teacher 1924-69)

The first Library was established Feb. 22, 1889 at the East School building by **Superintendent F. Gillman Cramer**. It was moved to the home of Frank McWhinney, the first block of West Fifth Street, in 1894. The first Librarian was **Miss Josie Ford**.

In 1901, a community committee headed by **D.L. Gaskill** approached **Andrew Carnegie** for financial help. Carnegie originally approved a grant of \$15,000. This was later increased by a supplemental grant of \$10,000. The cornerstone was laid Oct., 20, 1901. The building was dedicated March 19, 1903. Additional money for furnishing the new building in 1903 was supplied by **Henry St. Clair** and the Greenville School Board. A major expansion during 2006 to 2008 added wings to the north and south ends of the original building. The full modernization of this finished structure has made our Library one of the finest in the country.

GHS Alumni Project to Save a One-Room Schoolhouse in Darke County

(This was previously written in the Daily Advocate, February 2, 2026)

At one point in history, one-room schoolhouses dotted Darke County's countryside. **Bob Sharp** and **Jim Sommer**, both 1962 graduates of Greenville High School, have begun the process of saving one of those pieces of history. Sommer and Sharp pointed to a map of Darke County and were able to find the location of 210 one-room schools. There have been 105 torn down, 60 have been converted into residences and approximately 45 remain standing. According to the duo, many of those still standing are in deplorable condition. Some members of the GHS Alumni have taken up the mantle of trying to save at least one of the buildings. In fact, they have been working on securing one of the 45 buildings for at least 17 years. The hard work is paying off. Last spring, the group trying to save the schoolhouses received a donation of the Greenville Township, Joint District #19 schoolhouse located on the corner of Hillgrove-Woodington and Warvel Roads. School was held in that location from 1890 to 1930. According to the GHS AlumNews released last spring, the schoolhouse was one of the 23 country schools that once stood in Greenville Township. In order to make the dream a reality, a 501 (C)3 was formed by Sommer, Sharp and GHS Class of 1964 graduate **Dick Brown**. The new non-profit organization is Darke County Educational History, Inc. The goal of Darke County Educational History is to save and preserve at least one of the country schoolhouses and turn it into a working museum for future generations to see and perhaps, sit at a desk, use the chalkboard and get a sense of the education process these buildings provided to many generations. The group is currently working to restore the building and make it operational. It is hoped that third or fourth grade students will be able to spend one or more of their class days at the school and experience what their grandparents or great grandparents may have experienced. In order to achieve the goals of the non-profit, they hope to set up an on-going group that will request and accept donated or loaned artifacts, photos, etc. of the era. Ultimately, they would like to set up a computer system with archived photos of all available class photo which can be searchable by name. In early December, Darke County Educational History gave a progress report on the building and the grounds. The building was once hidden by trees and was slightly detectable from the roadway. Since acquiring the building, many of the trees have been removed. The grass has been cut and there are plans to add landscaping around the area. While there are some trees that are still standing, at least two of the trees, according to the group, need to be removed. One of the trees has branches touching the bell towers. Beyond the landscaping, the group has begun working on the building. A lock was replaced on the door with a replica door lock from the Columbus Architectural Salvage Store. They believe with some touch-up work, the door will look like it did in 1890.

Darke County Educational History noted that vandals had destroyed the windows, but they were fortunate to get a few of the windows from the Wakefield School before it was demolished. They spent two days removing five salvageable windows and 14 window weights. Eight of the upper windows have been completed, and at least eight lower windows will be installed in the spring. One of the areas that needs addressed before much more of the work can be completed is the floor. They had hoped the GHS Engineering Department would be able to help, but the instructor informed them it would be beyond their "scope of work". The ceiling will

also need to be repaired, and the group pointed out that both will require grant money to complete as both exceed their current resources. They are hoping the students at Greenville High School will be able to help with one of the projects at the old schoolhouse. In the progress report released in December, the report states, "They seemed interested in building a new bell tower as a school project for just the cost of materials." GMT Roofing was employed to seal the roof and donated the rain gutters and downspouts. Concrete has been purchased, and volunteers will fill in the small holes on the walls this spring. In order to make the dream a reality, Darke County Educational History, Inc. is seeking others to join their efforts. They want members to join them in their journey to preserve the legacy of the one-room schools. Anyone interested in this journey can contact them at oneroomschools@aol.com. 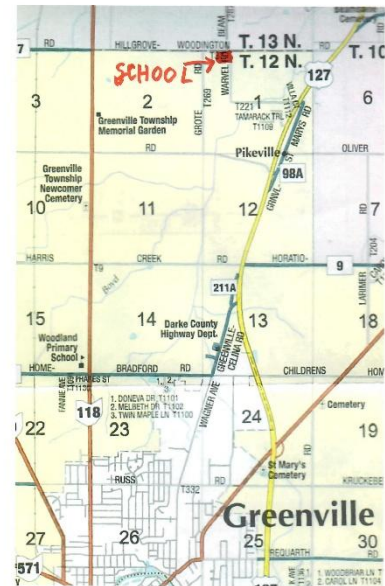


Location of this school house:

Drive north of Greenville on US Route 127 about 3.5 miles from Russ Road/Kruckeberg Road and past Pikeville about a half mile, turn left onto Warvel Road. It turns 90 degrees to the north in a half mile and continue for another half mile north to Hillgrove-Woodington Road. The schoolhouse is on the southwest corner of the road intersection.

If you go north on Route 118 a distance of 4 miles north of Russ Road, turn right onto Hillgrove-Woodington Road, go east 2.5 miles and the schoolhouse is on the southside at the corner of Warvel Road and Hillgrove-Woodington Road. Beam Road comes in from the north where the school house is.

Or, go north on Route 127 four miles, turn left onto Hillgrove-Woodington Road, go west 1.3 miles. Schoolhouse will be on the left at the first corner.

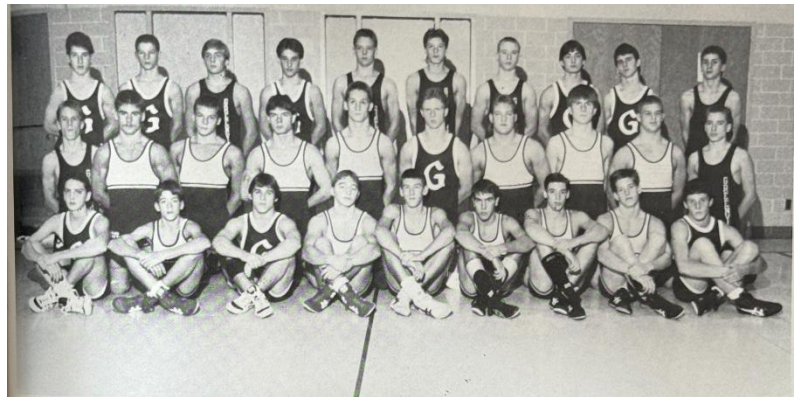

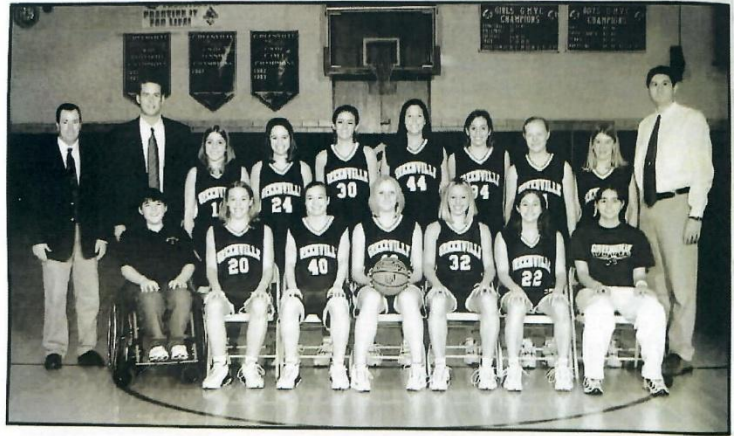

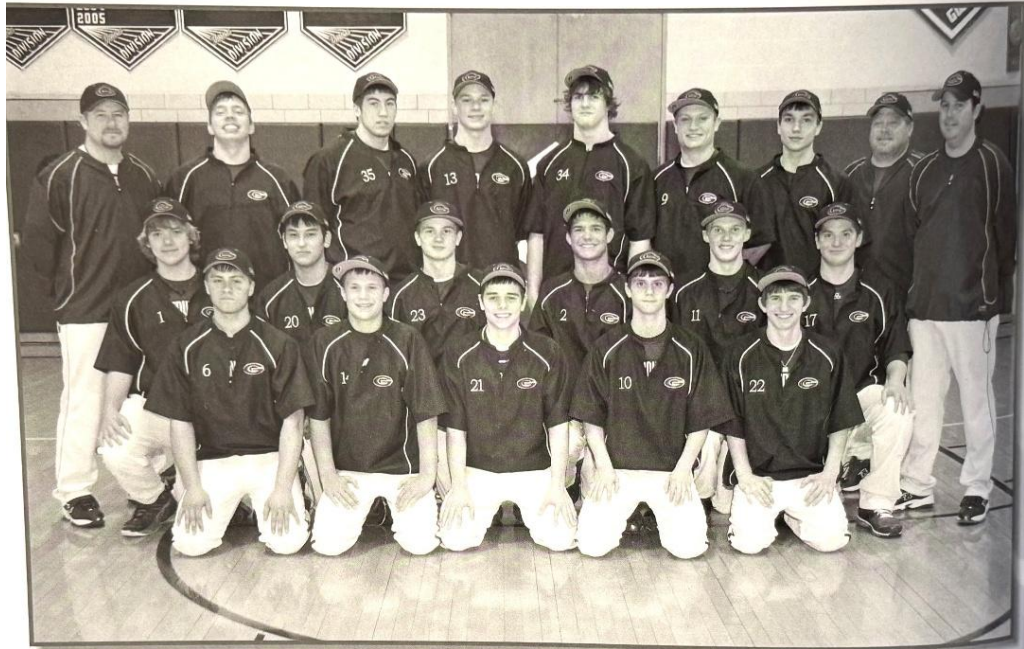
