To visit the imprisoned is a corporal work of mercy. Physically visiting them may prove logistically difficult, we offer an alternative to help assist those imprisoned, or confined. We aim to provide green scapulars to those imprisoned, or confined.

St Daniel of Padua was a convert to Catholicism. He served as a deacon under Saint Prosdocimus of Padua. During the reign of Emperor Marcus Aurelius, he was martyred in the year 168. We invoke him for those imprisoned, or in confinement.

On September 8, 1840, Our Lady revealed the Green Scapular to Sister Justine Bisqueyburu. Our Mother promised that this scapular would contribute to the conversion of souls, especially those with no faith, and would attain for them a happy death. The scapular has an image of Our Lady on one side of a single piece of green felt. On the other side shows Our Lady's Immaculate Heart pierced by a sword and dripping blood and a cross on top. Our Lady's prayer encircled the heart. It says "Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us now and at the hour of our death."
