



The National Little Britches Rodeo Association, which was founded in 1952, is a youth rodeo organization for kids' ages 5 to 18. The NLBRA's principal goal is to develop within its members and their families a spirit of fair competition and appreciation of good sportsmanship throughout the experience of healthy rodeo competition. More than 3,300 kids across 33 states compete annually at over 500 NLBRA sanctioned rodeos. Through these local franchise events contestants work to qualify for the National Finals event as well as compete for prizes such as saddles, buckles, scholarships and cash.

Flickerwood Little Britches Rodeo Association is a non-profit franchise of the NLBRA that was formed out of need for the youth in our region to have an event that would foster fair competition as well as provide a place to educate them in the sport of rodeo. We strive to teach kids responsibility and the importance of a strong work ethic. Leading by example we also encourage good practices in animal husbandry, agriculture and livestock management. Our founding board members have many years of experience and background in rodeo production and competition and are committed to making Flickerwood Little Britches Rodeo Association a long-lasting youth rodeo organization.
