

2 Tim. 3:16 "...equipped for every good work." January 14, 2018

"I HAVE A NEW LIFE"

(Rom. 6:4)

"We were buried therefore with him through baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we also might walk in newness of life," Rom. 6:4. This text is exceedingly powerful! There are many things stated in this verse and we shall give consideration to a few of them. This verse is teaching that as Jesus died on the cross and was buried, he then was raised from the dead with a glorious resurrection. It is stating, as Christ died and was buried; so, we die and are buried. We are buried **"with"** Christ and raised **"with"** Christ, in baptism. It is also stated we have **"died,"** we are **"buried"** and we are **"raised."** Read again carefully the text cited at the beginning of this article. There was a death, burial and a resurrection. We have a death, burial and a resurrection when we submit to baptism, so it states. Baptism is a **re-enactment** of the death, burial and resurrection of Christ. In baptism we die, are buried and raised with him that we may ***"walk in newness of life."***

Baptism becomes a **re-enactment** of the death, burial and resurrection of Christ. When we are buried **"with"** the Lord in baptism and raised **"with"** the Lord, it is stated, *"so we also might walk in newness of life,"* Rom. 6:4. The expression, ***"newness of life,"*** has to do with a change of life on our part. There is the **old man**, before baptism, and a **new man**, after baptism. This ***"newness of life,"*** can only have meaning when one is free from the **old man** and has been changed into **new man**. This is described as a ***"new Birth,"*** in Jno. 3:5. Do you remember Jesus teaching Nicodemus in Jno. 3:3-10 concerning the inward birth- a spiritual birth?

This **"old man"** and the **"new man"** is what happens when a person obeys the gospel – he walks in ***"newness of life,"*** Rom. 6:4. Paul is discussing this thought when he expressed what happened to him: *"13 who delivered us out of the power of darkness, and translated us into*

*the kingdom of the Son of his love," Col. 1:13. In this passage we are passing out of **darkness** into the **kingdom of Christ**. Another passage teaching the passing from one state to another is Rom. 12:2. Now, we need to appeal to Rom. 6:17-18: "17 But thanks be to God, that, whereas ye were servants of sin, ye became obedient from the heart to that form of teaching whereunto ye were delivered; 18 and being made free from sin, ye became servants of righteousness."*

I was baptized because of the teaching of the Lord: "16 He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that disbelieves shall be condemned," Mk. 16:16. By Faith, Repentance, Confession and Baptism I have passed from an **old state** to a "**new life in Christ Jesus.**" **I LIVE IN A NEW WORLD!** In this new world, I am told to "**be ye imitators of Christ,**" I Cor. 11:1. I have a new life! Rom. 6:4
