"I AM DYING!"

God had given a command to Adam and Eve to: "not eat of the tree of knowledge of good and evil," Gen. 2:17 and he told them at the same time, "for in the day thou eatest thereof thou shall surly die," Gen. 2:17. This death was to take place, "for in the day thou eatest thereof." This death was to take place the day they ate thereof. This death was a spiritual death and happened the day they violated the command of God.

There is another death mentioned in the third chapter of Genesis. This death had to do with a curse placed on man in general. This death was placed on man as a **physical death**, "19 in the sweat of thy face shall thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground; for out of it wast thou taken: for dust thou art, and unto dust shalt thou return," Gen. 3:19. After this Adam lived to be 930 years of age and he died, Gen. 5:5. This then is a death passed to all men, "27 And in as much as it is appointed unto men once to die," Heb. 9:27. You and I can expect this death — a **physical death**.

In our study today, I am concerned about this "physical death," – I AM DYING! Many have been the times, through the years, I have thought of death; but, not as much as in the last few years. The idea of "physical death" is more eminent. Physical death seems to provoke thought in the middle of the day, in the fullness of night, and in the early morning. My thoughts concerning death are not provoked by fear, dread, horror; but rather – looking forward to. There are thoughts concerning what it will be like, what it will look like and what my association with God, Christ, and the Holy Spirit will be like. I know the physical things of this life are used to help me understand what it will be like in a SPIRITUAL state; thus, there are many things conveyed that I do not understand now; but, will
