“Why Do Ships Sink?”

When you think of a ship on the water, what will make it sink? Water! However, ships don't sink because of the water around them; ships sink because of the water that gets in them. The same with a stone that has been in the middle of a flowing water brook for decades. You can pull that stone out of the water and open it up and you will find it bone dry. It didn't let the water in.

What is one thing that cannot be decided by others? No matter what someone does to us or says to us will make the decision regarding our attitude. Yes, external circumstances can affect the internal, but only if we let it in.

When we consider our society and societies take on “attitude”, it is a commodity that is irrepressible. If there is something that affects the routine of the day, especially something negative, then the day has officially been RUINED! Then if someone wants to know what is wrong with us, we provide them with an onslaught of reasons justifying the attitude and behavior associated with it. (i.e. “it can't be helped”). We either allow our thoughts to determine our emotions or our emotions to determine our thoughts.

It has always amazed me to read the life of Jesus and the life of Paul and all that they suffered at the hands of men, unjustly at that. Yet, even in the midst of those unjust sufferings, they always had a profound outlook on life. Even though the waters raged against Paul, he didn't let the water in. If he was arrested and thrown into prison, he decided to sing and pray! Paul shared with the brethren at Philippi in Philippians 4:6,7 “Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.” Paul would go on to tell them in verse 8 to dwell/meditate on things that are true, noble, just, pure, lovely, of good report, virtue and praise worthy things. Paul didn't just tell them, he demonstrated it through his life. Where did he learn it from? Jesus. It was Paul who told the Corinthian brethren to “imitate me, even as I also imitate Christ.” (1 Cor. 11:1). You see, Paul had already determined his thoughts. They were set on things above and nothing could penetrate his vessel,

because he wouldn't allow it. (Romans 8:18,19; 2 Corinthians 4:17)
Solomon tells us in Ecclesiastes that life comes with its problems, as well as injustices. However, he goes on to tell us to enjoy the life God has given us and accept the circumstances that come our way. Although we can't choose our circumstances, we can however choose how it affects us and how we respond to those circumstances.

A man by the name of Viktor Frankl stated the following: "Everything can be taken from a man but one thing: To choose one's attitude in any given set of circumstances, to choose one's way." Who was this man you might ask? He was one of the few survivors of the holocaust. Mr. Frankl was able to keep a positive outlook although he was in the middle of a horrific circumstance, because it was his decision.

I remember as a child singing in Bible class "I've got the JOY, JOY, JOY, JOY... DOWN IN MY HEART... TO STAY!" I think to myself as I have gotten older... do I still have it? Joy? Or have I let the water in to drown it out?

Remember, it is our choice as to what our outlook is. Paul would remind us today as he told the brethren at Philippi in Philippians 4:4, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I will say, rejoice!"; Philippians 4:11, "Not that I speak in regard to need, for I have learned whatever state I am, to be content." Disciples of Christ... there is SO MUCH for us to be JOYFUL about! May we not only speak of it, but also demonstrate it in our everyday lives. Such will show we are a peculiar people who proclaim the praises of Him who called us out of darkness into His marvelous light." (1 Peter 2:9).
My friends, as we sail from day to day in our lives, remember... don't let the water in!
