We must ask:

Are we keeping the LORD's commandments?
Are we obeying His statutes? Are we living Holy?

Answering these questions is necessary because the LORD encourages us in 1st Peter 1:16, "Be ye Holy for I am Holy"

But what happens when our lives don't truly reflect Christ, although we claim to be Christ Like?



- Are there consequences?
- Does this please God?
- Does the Bible give us guidance here?

Devotion, and Bible Study, Bishop Jerry Jackson,

Bishop invites us to consider this question by exploring (five) 5 key points of interest:



- I. What are the Causes of Misrepresentation?
- II. What it means to be a Child of GOD"
- III. What is a "New Creature"?
- IV. Is there Redemption in Christ?
- V. What are the Warnings?

Point I: Causes of Misrepresentation Part (A) Complacency

Complacency is a key issue for those who are misrepresenting themselves as Children of GOD.

Complacency is spiritual apathy, or false assurance and reliance on oneself, which makes us vulnerable to sin.

Even though we know to do good works and live a good life - we don't. "Knowing to do good and not doing it is sin". We are complacent and this demonstrates a lack of faith, and of course, "faith without works is dead".

James 4:17; James 2:17

Part (B) Shame

Shame is a place some people find themselves in and have a hard time rebounding from when they are not living a genuine life.

The only path they see forward is to fake it until they are exposed.

The result of being exposed for trying to be something or someone you are not can have devastating, even deadly consequences.

Part (C) Lack of Prayer

Without **Prayer** it is difficult to demonstrate a Christ like life. Having a life of prayer is usually manifested in our lifestyle.

Prayer allows for the working of the Holy Ghost and the building of our most holy faith as a mean by which we remain consistent in our walk.

Part (D) Looking Back

Often those who profess Christ, find themselves **looking back (tempted)** by a life of sin and shame they once lived.

Being steadfast, committed, and determined is necessary, even when the work or life's struggles seem insurmountable.

It is one thing to fall short or to not be qualified for the kingdom. It's another to not be <u>FIT</u> for the kingdom because of looking back.

Part (E) Bad Company

There is great danger in mingling with those who look and act like the world and speak as if they are of the world.

Satan's tactic is to make truth look like a lie and the lie look like truth.

Our mannerisms can not be corrupted by those things or people that masquerade as Children of God.

Point II WHO ARE THE CHILDREN OF GOD?



Being shepherded and guided by the Holy Spirit is more than a proclamation it is an affirmation that we are operating in the will of GOD.

Everything in our life, even our own spirit reflect the Spirit of GOD. It is then we become joint-heirs.

Point III WE ARE NEW CREATURES IN CHRIST

To reflect Christ, we must sanctify ourselves (which is to set aside ourselves from the model of this world) and seek after holiness.

Because we are His temple, we must rid ourselves of old, decayed and corrupted things, and reconcile with GOD, by being spiritually transformed to a NEW CREATURE, (Creation).
