We are still seeing significant growth of plants and shrubs. Orange jubilee shrubs as well as yellow bells are blooming. After being cut back in the fall, the Mexican Bird of Paradise plants are bright and beautiful. Lantanas continue to bloom as they are perennials that love the sun. As a perennial, they look very good for a while and then they die back a little, and then they bloom again. They are fairly hearty but in our extreme summer heat they can wilt a little, but they do recover.

Summer is here and the BrightView crew is hard at work, but earlier. They generally begin their work between 6 - 6:30 a.m. With our heat and to keep them safe, it is important that they take advantage of the somewhat cooler mornings so they are not out in the afternoon, the hottest part of the day.

I would like to remind everyone to please **not hand water** the plants, shrubs and trees that are on the Carmel Pointe irrigation system. If you water them and the irrigation system waters them, we run the risk of things being over-watered and stressed and they end up not looking good at all. If you have concerns about any plants, please let us know by calling the answering service as noted in the next paragraph.

A Word about Signs and Politics

Given that 2024 is an election year and not without strong opposing opinions among American voters, it seems appropriate to remind our members of some recommendations for an amicable existence, as well as certain statutes, rules and regulations that apply to all residents of Carmel Pointe.

Let's start with some simple common courtesies. Everyone is entitled to their opinion and to support the candidates of their choosing. It's neither possible nor necessary for everyone to agree and healthy, respectable dialogue is okay. Unfortunately, too often these discussions are more an attempt to convince another of why their views are wrong than they are to truly understand why someone holds the views they do, which may or may not be rooted in fact. One's best defense to counter opposing views is to exercise your right to vote. And this year may be more important than any in our lifetime.

Regarding signs, flags, etc., overarching governance can be found in Arizona Statutes at https://www.azleg.gov/ars/33/01808.htm. The statute provides discretion for limited variations by covenant controlled communities such as Carmel Pointe which includes a limitation on the placement of signs earlier than seventy-one days before the day of a primary election, and later than 15 days after a general election. For a sign for a candidate in a primary election who does not advance to the general election, later than fifteen days after the primary election.

Please note that <u>no signs may be placed withing the common area of Carmel Pointe nor on the front of the bulletin board,</u> which is strictly limited to HOA business.
