

# RB&CC visits Saratoga Springs, NY in 2024 Bruce Rodman

Hello everyone I've done some preliminary research about an RB&CC trip next summer to Saratoga Springs, NY & here are some thoughts.

**Dates:** Wednesday and Thursday nights, July 31 to August 1, 2024 (there is no racing on Mondays or Tuesdays, and weekends are challenging for dining and track reservations).

**Accommodations:** Several options, which would probably be left up to the individual members to make their own reservations. Several of the newer properties downtown are already sold out, but the Saratoga Hilton (downtown) is available for about \$400 per night. About 20 minutes south of Saratoga is the Hampton Inn of Clifton Park, NY for about \$215 per night. There are other options but probably not much else downtown.

Activities: Arrive **Wednesday** July 31 by noon, lunch downtown, which I could reserve. After lunch, a visit to the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame on Union Avenue, Saratoga Springs. Walking tour of downtown or catch the late races across the street. Dinner, which I would arrange.

**Thursday**: Arrive at Saratoga Racecourse around 7:30am for backstretch tour hosted by me as your tourguide, followed by breakfast on your own. 1PM -- attend the races at the oldest thoroughbred racetrack in the Americas, seating about \$50 per person to be arranged by me. Dinner, which I would arrange.

Friday: Depart

Arranging accommodations is the trickiest part -- my thinking is that each member would make his own reservations. I could try to get group rates and, if successful, communicate that info to interested members. The only thing that would be a "group" expense would be seating at the track, which I could front, and members reimburse me. Everyone could pay their own Museum fee, and the backstretch tour is free. Nonmembers are welcome, too.

#### It FLOATS to the Top (Paul Hester)

Welcome to the inaugural issue of this new section. Here we'll look at one member of our great Club and highlight who they are and what they've done in life and for our group. This section will appear at least quarterly. With that in mind, let's see who FLOATS to the Top this month.

As I thought about this new section one individual immediately popped into mind,



Lewis Anderson. It's only appropriate that the man who brought the Float back to life be its first recipient of this monthly recognition.

Lew was born in April 1938 in Sharpsville, PA, a small town in Western PA, near Youngstown Ohio. He graduated Penn State with a degree in Electrical Engineering in 1960, receiving a Naval ROTC commission.

Lew served in the U.S. Navy from 1960-1963. He was an Engineer Officer and served on the USS Brister (DE-327), an Edsall-class



destroyer escort recon in the South Pacific.

In addition to his Naval Service, Lew attended graduate school at MIT and Ohio State University. He worked for Bell Labs for over



thirty years from 1965 - 1999, mostly in Local Telephone Switching. One of his major projects was the No 5 ESS, a Local Telephone Switch. Additionally, he managed software development and software architecture.

Lew moved to New Jersey in 1991 and "retired" in 1999. I put that in quotes because when you do as much as Lew does, you can hardly call yourself retired. He served as a Trustee at Brookdale Community College from 1999 - 2012. He joined the Root Beer and Checker Club in Dec 2004, sponsored by Dave Smith. He served as a RBCC Board of Trustees from 2006-2009 and later as President from 2008 - 2009. In 2005 Lew started the West Point Football Game trips on Sea Streak at the request of Richard Huff, President, leading about 18 trips since. He has been a member of Sailing Clubs since 1963 and sailed a Flying Scot.

As mentioned earlier, Lew started/restarted the Root Beer Float sometime around 2006 at request of Ralph Wyndrum, President. He served as its Editor for the next 10 years. He spearheaded the movement of lunches from Knights of Columbus to Nauvoo Grill Club in Dec 2008 and started and continued to maintain the Root Beer Club Web Site. He spoke about Bitcoin (with Stuart Van Winkle) in April 2014.



Lew spends his spare time volunteering at Riverview Medical Center. And of course we're lucky to get some of that spare time enjoying his company at our weekly lunches.

Lew is a 2011 recipient of the coveted Eight Ball Award.

Lew is married to Joyce Vickerman since 1961. He has one son and 2 grandchildren.





# 2017 Great Eclipse expedition to Nashville, TN Rich and Nancy Vodhanel.

The next great eclipse that crosses the USA from Texas to Maine is coming up soon, April 8, 2024. For the August 21, 2017 eclipse, Nancy and I drove out to Tennessee, to a spot near Nashville. The widely anticipated 2017 eclipse path of totality entered the USA at the Oregon Coast, crossed the entire USA, and exited to the Atlantic near Columbia, SC. Rather than flying all the way out to Idaho, we picked a spot we could drive to – hoping for good weather. We stayed in Cookeville, on the path of totality, just east of Nashville. The weather was great, sunny skies with no clouds! We made a week long 'expedition' for a 2 minute and 20 second total eclipse viewing experience, with some fun sightseeing along the way. These photos were taken during our 2017 eclipse expedition to Tennessee.

Nancy and I spent two days in Nashville and took in a show at the Grand Ole Opry. On the way out of town, we visited the Gaylord Opryland Resort and saw the high water mark from the disastrous flood of May, 2010. The stage of the Grand Oly Opry was also flooded then, and had to be rebuilt.

Our hotel in Cookeville allowed people to sit out on their lawn to watch the eclipse. We had special glasses that let you safely look at the crescent sun. During totality, the moon completely blocked the sun and it was safe to take off our glasses. The solar corona was bright and shimmering. The sky and everything around us was very dark, like after sunset. That was a magical once in a lifetime experience.

On the way home, we spent a day at Biltmore in Ashville, NC, then drove through the Great Smokey Mountains National Park, and even passed right by Dollywood. *(cont.)*






#### The "Hills" of Malta - Jerry Mahood

My wife Nancy found this amazing photo on the internet with info on how it was taken. It describes a photo capturing a rare alignment of the crescent moon setting behind a mountain with a basilica in the foreground. The photo was taken near Turin Italy last December. *RV* 

Photographer Captures Moon, Mountain, and Basilica in One Incredible Photo Photographer Valerio Minato had to wait for six years to capture a stunning triplealignment photo of the crescent Moon setting behind a mountain with a Basilica in the foreground.



Valerio Minato took the one-of-a-kind photo near Turin, Italy on December 15, 2023 after his five previous attempts to get the shot were thwarted by bad weather. He called it a" fulfillment of a dream."

Shooting the Photo: Minato was perched in the small village of Castagneto Po; from there, the Basilica of Superga is roughly 35 miles and Monte Viso is a further 60 miles. To bring these elements together, Minato used a 500mm f/4 lens attached to a Canon R5 camera.

Describing it as a "magical moment", Minato explains that for a few brief seconds — Monte Viso, the Basilica of Superga, and a crescent Moon gave a unique spectacle. The amazing photo was recently selected by NASA for its Photo of the Day; the space agency explains that although the setting Moon is captured in a crescent phase, the exposure still captures the entire Moon thanks to the aptly-named da Vinci glow; which is doubly-reflected Earthlight. Earthlight — also known as the Moon's ashen glow — is indirect sunlight dimly illuminating the otherwise unilluminated portion of the Moon.


