

Guglielmo Achille Cavellini (1914-1990) was an Italian artist and art collector. He created Neo-Dada art, performance art, was a prolific mail artist (a fervent practitioner of "round trip" works) and book artist who also published stamps and selfadhesive labels. As an artist publisher, during the 1970-1990s, he authored an extensive oeuvre of self-referential publications about his performances and mail art – a practice he referred to as "autostoricizzazione".



Galeria Akumulatory 2 gallery, Poznań, Poland, was founded and run by the Polish conceptual artist Jarosław Kozłowski. The gallery hosted numerous solo exhibitions by international conceptual artists and a Fluxus Festival in 1977. 
May Wilson (1905 - 1986)

Wilson was an eccentric figure within the New York City avant-garde art world during the 1960s to 1980s and a pioneer of the feminist and mail art movements. She is best known for her "Ridiculous Portrait" photo-collages. The "ridiculous portraits" explore, through humorous juxtapositions, the representation of women in art and mass media – the works were constructed by collaging self-portraits (sometimes photo-booth portraits) onto reproductions of paintings and photographs of idealized women such as religious figures, classical nudes, and imagery from popular culture sources. In addition she also created spray-painted stencil (snowflake) paintings on paper, junk assemblage sculpture, and "wiggly eyes" collages where plastic novelty wiggly eyes were affixed to images of faces including illustrations from fashion magazines.






