Pot Pitch

The Paddock Hills Assembly is asking for donations from residents interested in sponsoring one of the six flower pots that decorate entrances to the neighborhood.

For several year Paddock Hills has partnered with the city in the flower pot program. We split the cost with the city. In return, the city maintains the pot displays, including plant design and purchases, pruning and watering, and changing the displays seasonally. As part of the cost sharing, the neighborhood has paid \$200 per pot.

This year, the city has increased that cost sharing to \$330 per pot.

At the January Community Meeting, PH trustees felt it is a beatification effort worth continuing. Faced with a deadline to sign up for this year's program, the trustees voted to appropriate money to cover the increased costs, but decided to ask residents to consider pot sponsorships to help defray the cost.

Two pots are already fully covered by donations from two residents. More sponsorships are welcome. Please consider a \$330 sponsorship which could be dedicated "in memoriam" with appropriate signage for a loved one.

Donations of any kind are welcome to defray the cost.

Healthy Neighborhood Meeting

Vice Mayor Jan-Michele Lemon Kearney has been holding a series of meetings with representatives from each of the city's 52 neighborhoods.

Billed as a "Healthy Neighborhood" discussion, it is as a way for residents to communicate directly with city council members and other city officials about the biggest problems facing their communities.

It is Paddock Hills' turn for the meeting to be held 5:30 p.m. Feb 21 with a location yet to be determined (We will send out an email announcement when a site has been finalized.)

The meeting is open to all Paddock Hills residents.

The concept of the session is to "highlight the things that make Paddock Hills special and vocalize concerns and troubles you might be experiencing," according to a spokesman for the Vice Mayor's office.

Several PH Trustees plan to attend and raise several issues that have been consistently brought up over the months at community meetings.

They include: litter (especially on the area expressway ramps,), water ponding issues at some street corners, and concerns about panhandling, drug dealing and other safety issues at area gas stations/carryouts.

Sugar 'n Spice Update

A spokeswoman for owner Adam Mayerson said as of this writing Sugar N Spice is "real close" to reopening after being closed since November of '22 for a major remodeling that includes expanded space, a new kitchen and to-go window.

The much delayed opening, originally set for last fall, has apparently fallen victim to "finishing issues," according to the spokeswoman.

We will certainly send out an email blast to the neighborhood when we hear a solid opening date, which we expect could come in the next couple weeks.


Congratulations Ruthemeyer Family!!
