Agenda item: APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Discussion:

For this item, a review of last month's minutes were presented by Claudia and the Coalition members were asked to approve it or tell us if we need to modify something. Minutes were approved by the present Coalition members.

• What is used to reverse an overdose?

Naloxone and Narcan are medication that can reverse an opioid overdose and save a life


- Signs of an overdose
 - o Deep snoring/gurgling, hard to wake up, or vomiting
 - Slow/shallow to not breathing, gurgling, or chocking sounds
 - Pale, blue, or gray lips, fingernails, or clammy sweaty skin
 - o Unconsciousness or inability to awaken
 - o Slow heartbeat
- Stimulate the person
 - Check responsiveness
 - o Ask if they are okay
 - o Shake their shoulder
 - Perform a sternum rub
 - Check to see if they are breathing
 - Look, listen, and feel
 - Call 911 if they are not responsive or not breathing
- Naloxone/Narcan® use
 - Remove Narcan® Nasal Spray from the box
 - Peel back the tab with the circle to open the packaging
 - Hold the Narcan® Nasal Spray with your thumb on the bottom of the plunger and your first and middle fingers on either side of the nozzle
 - o Gently insert the tip of the nozzle in either nostril
 - o Press the plunger firmly to give the dose
 - Remove the plunger from the nostril
 - If there is no reaction in 2-3 minutes or if the person stops breathing again, give the second dose of Naloxone into the other nostril using a new spray device
- What if they do not respond?

- Repeat steps 1-6 using a new Narcan® Nasal Spray
- Stay with the person (Naloxone loses effect 30-90 minutes after use)
- o Perform CPR until medical professionals arrive, only if you're trained in CPR
- Injectable Naloxone use
 - Follow the same steps on how to stimulate the person, then call 911
 - o Safely remove all contents of the Naloxone kit onto a flat surface
 - o Make sure not to poke yourself while removing the cap from the needle
 - o Turn the Naloxone vial upside down and draw out 1mL of Naloxone into the syringe
 - Ensure there are no air bubbles in the syringe by slightly flicking it and pressing on the plunger to release any air
 - o Safely locate the injection site: either upper shoulder (deltoid), outer thigh muscle (quad) or upper buttock area
 - o Depress the full 1mL into the injection site and carefully remove the needle
 - o Dispose of the needle into a sharp's container if available
 - o If there is no sharps container available, carefully recap the needle using the original cap
- Recovery position
 - o Put them in the recovery position once they start to breathe
- Arizona Good Samaritan Law

Protects someone attempting to help a person during an overdose

- o Must be in good faith
- For no money or other consideration
- o Prevents criminal prosecution for drug offenses
- When to use Naloxone
