ACT OF COMMITMENT

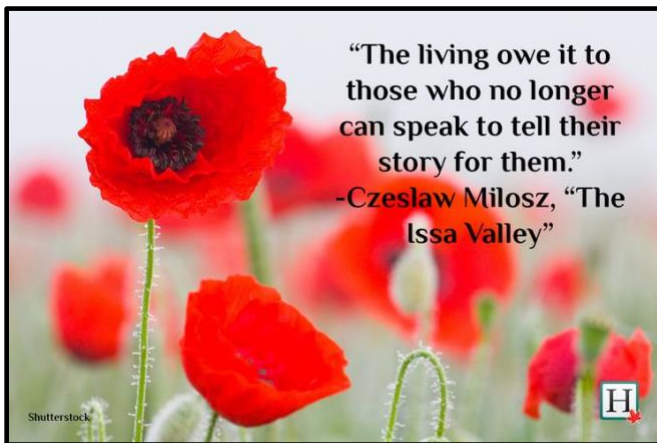
