Valentine's Day Pet Treats Recipe Ingredients:

- 2 1/2 cups whole wheat flour (you can substitute with coconut flour or any other pet-safe alternative if your pet is sensitive to wheat)
- legg
- 1 cup of water
- 1/2 cup pureed pumpkin (ensure it's plain pumpkin, not the spiced pie filling)
- 2 tablespoons peanut butter (xylitol-free)

For Cats:

 Replace the pumpkin and peanut butter with 1 can of unsalted, drained tuna or salmon in water.

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat your oven to 350°F (175°C).
- 2.Mix the ingredients: In a large bowl, combine the flour, egg, pureed pumpkin, peanut butter, and cinnamon. For cats, mix the flour, egg, and fish. Gradually add water until the mixture is thick but manageable.
- 3. Knead the dough: Turn the dough onto a floured surface and knead it until it's mixed thoroughly.
- 4.Roll out the dough to about 1/4 inch
- 5.Cut out treats using a heart-shaped cookie cutter to fit the Valentine theme.
- 6. Place the treats on a parchment-lined baking sheet.
- 7.Bake for 30 to 40 minutes, or until the treats are hard and golden brown.
- 8.Cool the treats completely on a wire rack before serving them to your pet or storing them in an airtight container.

These homemade treats are a healthy way to indulge your pets on Valentine's Day and can be adapted for either dogs or cats by tweaking the ingredients to suit their dietary needs. Always check with your vet before introducing new ingredients into your pet's diet to ensure they are safe and appropriate for your specific pet.
