MCFA Teams Up with *Mountain Pet Rescue* to Aid Hurricane-Affected Animals

Monroe County Friends of Animals (MCFA) is partnering with Mountain Pet Rescue of Asheville to provide relief for animals affected by Hurricane Helene. The storm has displaced numerous pets in need of food, shelter, and care. To support these efforts, we are collecting donations of dog food, cat food, kitty litter, and small and large cat carriers. These supplies will be crucial in helping Mountain Pet Rescue care for and rehome animals impacted by the storm.

Our first delivery of supplies to Asheville is fast approaching, and we are deeply grateful to everyone who has contributed so far. Donations will be accepted through the end of October at Eastbourne Animal Center, 130 Kefauver Ln, Madisonville, TN. Every donation, no matter the size, helps ensure that displaced pets receive the care they desperately need.

In addition to supplies, spreading the word is another powerful way to help. By sharing our efforts with friends, family, and on social media using the hashtag #MCFAnimalsHelene, you can increase awareness and inspire others to contribute. The more people who know about this initiative, the more resources we can gather to support animals displaced by the storm.



MCFA is excited to announce the resumption of our Pet Food Pantry program, a vital community resource aimed at assisting Monroe County families and individuals facing financial hardships. Understanding the importance of pets in our lives, this program seeks to provide temporary support by offering cat and dog food, ensuring that no pet goes hungry during tough times. The pantry is made possible through the generous donations of food from compassionate individuals and organizations within our community.

Starting this month, the Pet Food Pantry will distribute food on the 1st and 3rd Mondays of each month, from noon until 2 pm at the Eastbourne Animal Center, located at 130 Kefauver Ln, Madisonville. Safe Halloween with Pets

- Keep Candy Out of Reach:
 - Chocolate and xylitol, a common sweetener in sugar-free candies, are toxic to pets. Ensure all Halloween candy is stored away from your pet's reach to prevent accidental ingestion.
- Costume Caution: If dressing up your pet for Halloween, make sure the costume doesn't restrict movement, sight, or the ability to breathe. Always supervise your pet to ensure they're comfortable and safe in their costume.
- Decorations Safety: Keep glow sticks, fake cobwebs, and electric decorations out of pets' reach.
 Curious pets can easily entangle themselves or ingest hazardous materials, leading to emergencies.
- Secure Pets During Trick-or-Treating: The frequent opening of doors and the presence of strangers can be stressful for pets and may result in escape attempts. Keep pets in a secure, quiet room during peak trick-or-treating hours to reduce stress and prevent escapes.
