## Dear We the People

We are a small group of old white men, loosely connected by friendship and tightly bound by a deep love of America, We are unwilling to remain silent while Donald Trump scorns our values and corrupts our country. While "old white men" are on occasion profiled as supporters of the cult and culture of Trumpism, we reject its divisive tenets and affirm our belief that this nation can remain the beacon of liberty and hope for the oppressed it has been for more than two centuries if it lives up to its often proclaimed values. We add our voices to the groundswell demanding that our U.S. Senators and Members of Congress block Trump's attempt to replace our democracy with his autocracy. We demand that the "leaders" in whom we have placed our trust acknowledge the danger, and lead us into an election where we can stifle this threat. How much courage does it take for them to do the right thing? After all, they are Americans.

We identify ourselves as old white men, but we assert no claim to wisdom, or authority, or status, or entitlement to deference, or anything else, but ask for the respect due all American citizens who express their thoughts. Donald Trump has deeply injured our country, and another term for him will result in irreparable damage to us all. Our government is being betrayed by Trump. We the People must take it back from this incompetent aspiring autocrat. We have little previous political experience, and differ in our political views, but we have always tried to cast intelligent votes. We believe that the United States of America is the greatest country on earth, but fear we may lose it.

Most of us are veterans of our armed forces, many having served in-country Vietnam and in other foreign lands. We are no longer in uniform, but we consider ourselves bound by our oaths to preserve, protect and defend our Constitution, which we hold to be our bulwark against authoritarianism. We share the belief that we have much to do to make America truly great; we must eradicate the corrosive influences of improper and unlawful discrimination on the basis of race, gender, sexual orientation, national origin and ethnicity. We the People must acknowledge truth and stand for justice. We must try to mitigate the injury of climate change. We must reverse the growing gap of income and asset inequality. We must work so that all of us have access to good health care and a quality education. Attacks on the responsible journalists who inform us of the truth must stop. We the People must demand that our representatives in Congress speak out to support those wrongfully threatened by the president. We must demand that the appropriate Members of Congress be informed of the content, in detail, of Trump's conversations with foreign leaders, and in particular Putin and Kim. They are bad men, and covert deals with them are a threat to us.

We the People demand honest government. Our representatives must confront Trump, and restrain him and his cronies until we can wrest power away from them. Trump is not our king, and we will not allow him to abuse us any longer. We ask you to join our friends and neighbors, and our fellow citizens across the country, in the movement to save our republic.
