# Blue's News

Galatians 6:7-10

<sup>7</sup> Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. <sup>8</sup> Whoever sows to please their flesh, from the flesh will reap destruction; whoever sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life. <sup>9</sup> Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. <sup>10</sup> Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers.

The continuation of Phase Two has brought with it a deep disappointment on two fronts: the continued crowd limitations, and an upward spread of the virus in our area. Phase Two protocols will continue through July 23<sup>rd</sup>. What will happen then? Wait and see. The purpose for the continuation is a drastic effort to curb the spread of the Covid-19 virus so school can begin in August. As such, this continuation also affects our churches' ability to provide child care on Sundays along with children's Bible study activities. We can have some children's activities on a strictly limited basis right now, but the restrictions hamper more than they help our situations.

My view on Covid-19: I am working hard to avoid catching it. While some recover quickly and without any apparent side effects, others face extreme difficulties that require hospitalization and may lead to death. Only time will reveal the long-term effects of this bug on its victims. Do not take this lightly and do not stand down in your mitigation efforts. Do not embarrass anyone who wants to wear a mask or not shake hands.

What must we do? Do not quit! We reap what we sow, more than we sow, later than we sow. Be faithful in the doing the things we need to do to keep our churches on track for the day when we can finally have our church families back together. Our Sunday School playbook has some of the same plays we need to execute. Also, there are some new plays we need to learn. Demonstrate due diligence. Go the second mile.

- Lead your congregation in practicing good hygiene and wearing masks.
- Prepare your church for when we can finally reopen fully. Remember, you eat at restaurants that appear to be the cleanest and take this virus serious. You want your church to have the same appearance.
- Nominating Committees need to work. The new church year begins in September and will be here before we know it
- Training must be held for new and returning teachers—especially on the how-to under Phase Three protocols when they arrive.
- ◆ Cultivate...Tend and care for your congregations the best way you know how. Consider using Sunday School teachers/care leaders to contact their classes.
- Do not box-in your Sunday School classes. It is still a small group Sunday School class if they meet on any
  other day of the week than Sunday. Some classes might consider making their weekday meeting time permanent.

#### Specialized Training:

Sean Keith, Sunday School/Discipleship Strategist for the LBC is offering online training for teachers. Our state convention is doing all they can do to provide churches with the opportunity to train our Sunday School/small group teachers and leaders through webinars before the new church year begins. #### Re-Engaging Your Sunday School or Small Groups Ministry


