Together We Do What We Cannot Do Alone

I became pastor of my first church in 1979. I was green, and really had no idea what I was to do. Yet, Bro. Clyde, our Sunday School Director, knew to order for me some magazines (you know, blogs printed on slick paper). Lifeway produced the Church Administration Magazine. Each issue had the organization steps a church should consider for that season. Each article began like this, "This is the time of the year where you need to think about these things..." Get this—for the churches who did Wednesday night supper, the magazine included a new recipe, which ended with words like these, *serves 30-35 people*. Wow!

In college and seminary, I was trained to teach and preach God's Word. I was trained in the art of pastoral ministry, but had little training focused on organizing, planning, and leading a church. That training came from the school of hard knocks. Long range planning back then was figuring out if we had enough gas and money left at the end of the week to drive 30 miles after Sunday night church to the Dairy Queen for a ten-cent ice cream cone. Gas had sky-rocketed from .31 cents a gallon to \$1.05 per gallon. Hmmm! Sounds familiar, right? Let me help you like Jim Hightower and Bruce Powers helped me.

Pastors, take some time to consider the rest of 2022. Back-to-school is sneaking up on us. Most churches have their high attendance day when school starts back. This is the time to consolidate the gains made from your hard summer work with children and youth camps. It is also the time to regather the flock who has scattered through the summer for vacation and other activities. **The Forge** is a cooperative ELBA event to help your church's youth. This serves as a D-Now catalyst to help your youth to grow and practice their faith moving forward.

Failing to plan is planning to fail. Pray. Ask God to open your eyes to see where He is working. Include others in this planning who have a heart for God and understand the work of the church. Discover one thing your church can do to advance the gospel between now and the end of the year. Determine the necessary steps to make this happen. Logical launching points for ministry action can be Fall Festivals, Thanksgiving, and pre-Christmas. Act quickly. These launching points will come and go before you know it.

Small groups, Sunday School, and church organization: July-August is time of the year to renew commitments of teachers and leaders for the new church year starting in September. This is also the time of the year to find replacements for vacant teaching assignments, fill vacant committee spots, review ministry team needs, and maybe restructure the work of the church moving forward. Do not forget to elect your pastor and one other person to the Executive Board for EL-BA. A lay person on the Executive Board gives the congregation a different perspective on the cooperative work through the association—just a thought!

People for the work of evangelism. This will be a high-quality event with Dr. Preston Nix, Evangelism Professor of NOBTS who will lead pastors and key lay people in how to make your church an evangelistic church. Josh Spinks, pastor of The Way Church is the trainer for E3 Ministries who will provide training for lay-people to share their faith in a very simple way. KaRetha Kelley, Child Evangelism Fellowship missionary, will teach our children's teachers in two sessions how to share the gospel with children using the Wordless Book in the morning and in the afternoon Leading a Child to Christ. Jarrod Hegwood, former youth pastor, will teach youth teachers and leaders how to develop a culture of evangelism in your youth group. Please note the time and place information in this newsletter and begin promoting ECON-LP with your people. What would happen in your church if 10-15 people in your church are instructed and motivated to share their faith with others? What would happen in our world if this would happen?

The Internal Revenue Service announced an increase in the optional standard mileage rate for the final 6 months of 2022. Taxpayers may use the optional standard mileage rates to calculate the deductible costs of operating an automobile for business and certain other purposes.

For the final 6 months of 2022, the standard mileage rate for business travel will be 62.5 cents per mile, up 4 cents from the rate effective at the start of the year. The new rates become effective July 1, 2022. Announcement 2022-13.
