

ORDINANCE NO. 220.48

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 220.46 BY REPEALING THOSE PORTIONS THEREOF WHICH ESTABLISH AND IMPLEMENT A 911 FEE ON TELEPHONE LAND LINES

WHEREAS, Hart County Ordinance No. 220.9 established a system for financial support of 911 emergency services based upon a charge on telephone land lines in Hart County, Kentucky, collected by a telephone utility and distributed directly to the Hart County Fiscal Court for the administration of 911 emergency services; and

WHEREAS, Hart County Ordinance No. 220.46 amended Ordinance No. 220.9 by establishing a fee on active water services provided to occupied households; apartments; each apartment unit in an apartment complex; businesses; and agribusinesses in Hart County, Kentucky, calculated at \$ 3.00 per active water meter per month to take effect on the 1st day of January, 2020; and


WHEREAS, the Hart Fiscal Court desires to amend Hart County Ordinance 220.9 by repealing those portions which establish and implement a 911 fee on telephone land lines, with financial support of 911 emergency services to be implemented through the fee on active water services as set forth in Hart County Ordinance 220.46;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the Hart County Fiscal Court as follows:

SECTION 1. Hart County Ordinance 220.9 be and is hereby amended such that all those portions thereof which establish and administer 911 emergency services fee on telephone land lines is hereby repealed. The remaining portions of Hart County Ordinance 220.9, not amended and repealed hereby, shall be implemented through the remaining portions of Hart County Ordinance 220.9 and the service fee on active water meters as set forth in Hart County Ordinances 220.46 and 220.47.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect on the 1st day of March 2020.

First Reading: Introduced for the first reading on Motion made by Doug Wells and seconded by Lee Miles and passed by majority vote of the Hart Fiscal Court in duly assembled session on the 9th day of January, 2020.


