

Just like an acorn, we as Christians are growing and changing all the time. We start out small, but with God's help, we can grow into strong and mighty followers of Jesus.




Now, that's curious. The old man saw Jesus because he didn't know what he looked like. The people in Jesus' day missed him because they thought they did.
