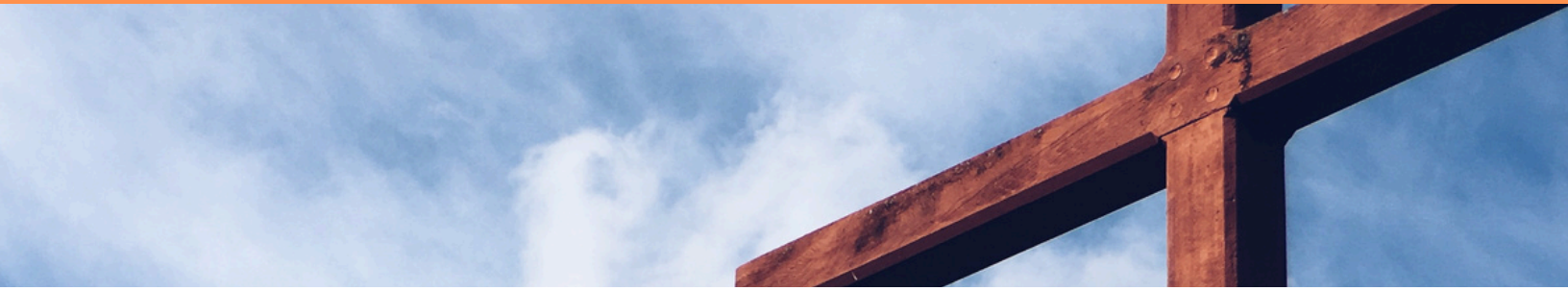


MESSENGER

Hello from Jacksonville!

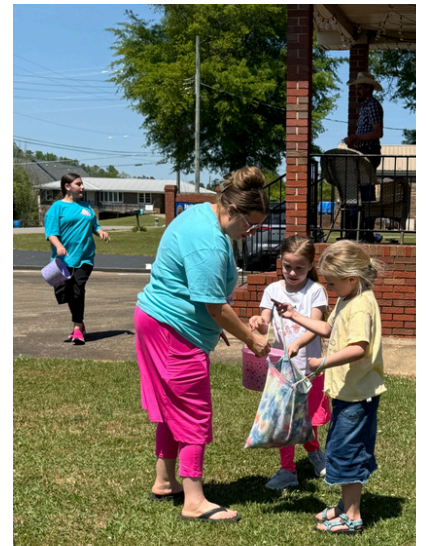

24 Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock: And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell not: for it was founded upon a rock. - Matthew 7:24-27

It doesn't matter how good the blocks are, if the foundation is shifty the whole thing falls apart. You can have a good personality and good intentions but if your foundation is worldly you will eventually collapse. Take for instance a real coin and a fake one, from a distance they look identical. Many things in your life, friendships, music, habits look fine on the surface but they have no actual value just like a fake coin. In eternity a lot of people spend their years building the house but never check the foundation.

Jesus is finishing The Sermon on the Mount. He's given the instructions or blueprints for a blessed life. Now, He gives the warning that there were two builders. Both men were building. Both houses look great from the outside. Both builders worked hard.

Building on sand is fast and easy. It's Instagram logic, build where it's trendy and where everyone else is. Building on a rock requires digging. It's hard work. It's boring to others. It requires sweat and discipline.

Notice the storm hit both houses. Being a Christian doesn't stop the rain, it just stops the ruin. The difference wasn't the appearance of the house, it was the attachment to the ground.

If you are not anchored to the Word then you're just waiting for the wind. We believe the Word of God isn't just a good book, it is a living breathing foundation. To build on the Rock means to be doers of the word and not hearers only.

Ask yourself these questions: When someone hurts your feelings or you get bad news, what is your first reaction? Do you go to the altar or to the app (social media)? In construction a level tells you if a wall is straight. Is your life level with the King James Version, or are you trying to bend the Bible to fit your lifestyle? Hebrews 6:19 says we have an anchor for the soul. If you were stripped of your phone, your sports, and your squad would you still be standing?

Sand is just tiny pieces of rock that have been broken down. This is how the world works: it takes Godly truths and grinds them down until they are shifting and relative.

Lord help us to be more than just churchgoers help us to be Word builders. Dig deep into our hearts and remove the sand of worldliness so we can stand firm on the Rock of Ages!



Attitude check! Remember that from youth camp? Some leader screams "Attitude check!" and everyone shouts back, "Praise the Lord!" at the top of their lungs. It is hype, it is loud, and it totally shifts the atmosphere. But honestly? What if we carried that same energy into our adult lives?

What if we didn't wait for a conference, campmeeting/revival or a special guest speaker to fix our focus? Imagine if we actually did this every single service, or better yet, every single morning. What if we decided to actually check our attitude at the door before we even stepped foot into the sanctuary?

If we're being real, sometimes we walk into God's house carrying a lot of extra baggage that has nothing to do with the Spirit. We've got the grumbling about the parking, the volume of the worship, or how long the service is running. The complaining about our week, the temperature, or what someone else is doing or not doing. Don't forget the judgment eyeing what someone else is wearing, how they're acting, or wondering why so-and-so is at the altar...again.

The Psalm 100:4 says we are to "Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise."

It doesn't say enter His gates with a list of grievances and a side of side-eye.

What if we decided that the moment our feet hit the foyer, we were aligning our hearts and minds to His will?

Better yet how about we purpose that in our hearts before we even leave home. No distractions, no bitterness, just a pure, God, what can I do for You in this service vibe.

When we clear out our attitudes, we actually make room for the Spirit to move.

Let's check ourselves at the door and see how much faster the fire falls when our hearts are actually ready to catch it.



Greetings Ladies! I know God is blessing in your corner of the field! He is greatly to be praised! I have a verse of scripture that is on my mind that I want to share and I pray that it encourages you as much as it does me each time I read it. Thank God for His powerful Word!

**Rejoicing in hope;
Patient in tribulation;
continuing
instant in prayer.
Romans 12:12**

I. "Rejoice in Hope"

What is "hope" here? This isn't a wishy-washy "I hope so" kind of hope. In the biblical sense, **HOPE is a confident expectation, a sure and certain anticipation of God's promises.** It's grounded in God's character and His faithfulness. Our hope is in Jesus Christ, His finished work on the cross, His resurrection, and His promise of eternal life and future glory. *Why "rejoice" in it?* Even when circumstances are bleak, we can rejoice because our hope is secure. It's not dependent on our feelings or what we see around us.

Rejoicing in hope changes our perspective. Instead of being consumed by the immediate problem, we remember that God is sovereign, He has a plan, and our ultimate future is secure with Him. This allows us to see our present struggles in light of eternity.

This deep-seated hope provides inner strength. It's an anchor for our souls (Hebrews 6:19). When the winds of adversity blow, hope keeps us from being tossed about aimlessly.

Think of women in the Bible who rejoiced in hope despite incredible odds – Sarah waiting for a son, Hannah praying for a child, Mary accepting God's call despite the social implications

II. "Be Patient in Tribulation"

What is "tribulation"? This refers to suffering, distress, affliction, pressure, or trouble. Life is messy, and tribulation is inevitable. Jesus told us we would have trouble in this world (John 16:33).

What does "patient" mean? It's not passive resignation, but active endurance. It means to bear up under pressure, to persevere with steadfastness and fortitude. It's about enduring without giving in to despair or bitterness.

Patience in tribulation produces character (Romans 5:3-4). God uses difficult times to refine us, strengthen our faith, and draw us closer to Him. It's through the fire that gold is purified.

Patience requires trusting God's timing, even when it doesn't align with our own. We may want immediate relief, but God often uses the process of waiting to teach us important lessons.

When we're impatient, we can make rash decisions that only complicate matters. Patience allows for wisdom and discernment.

Joseph endured immense tribulation – betrayal, slavery, unjust imprisonment – but he remained patient, and God ultimately exalted him for His purposes.

III. "Be Constant in Prayer"

What does "constant" mean? ***It means steadfast, persistent, always ready, devoted.*** It's not about praying 24/7 without stopping, but rather maintaining a continuous attitude of prayer, always being connected to God, ready to communicate with Him. **It's about making prayer a regular, integral part of our lives, not just a last resort.**

Why is this crucial? Prayer is our direct line to God. It's how we communicate our needs, fears, thanksgivings, and desires to Him. It's how we invite Him into our circumstances.

Prayer taps into God's infinite power and wisdom. When we feel weak, overwhelmed, or don't know what to do, prayer allows us to lean on Him.

Through prayer, we can cast our anxieties on Him (1 Peter 5:7) and experience His peace that surpasses all understanding (Philippians 4:6-7).

Prayer allows us to seek God's guidance and direction when we're facing tough decisions or feeling lost.

Prayer is a vital weapon in spiritual warfare. When we face opposition, whether from external circumstances or spiritual attacks, prayer strengthens our defenses and allows God to fight on our behalf.

The more we pray and see God answer, the more our faith grows.

How They Work Together

These three commands aren't isolated; they are interconnected and mutually reinforcing.

Hope fuels patience: Because we have a sure hope, we can patiently endure. We know the outcome, even if the present is difficult.

Patience drives us to prayer: When enduring tribulation, our natural inclination might be to despair. But patience reminds us that God is working, and that drives us to constant prayer, seeking His strength and comfort.

Prayer strengthens hope and patience: Consistent prayer keeps our hope alive by reminding us of God's character and promises. It also gives us the inner strength and resilience to be patient.

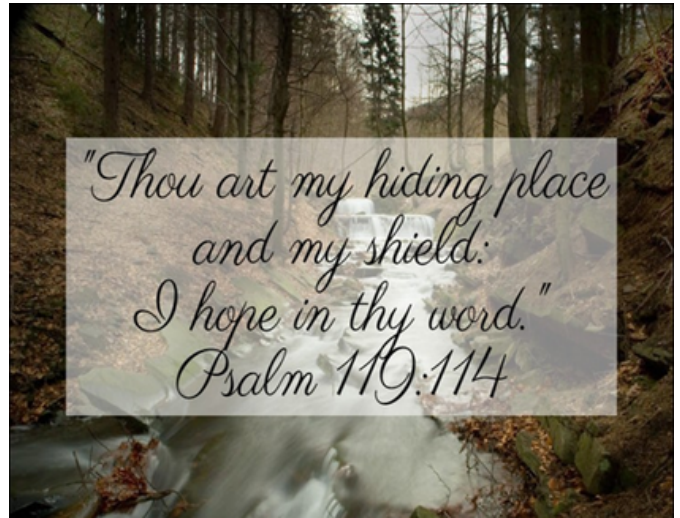
Analogy: Think of them as three legs of a stool. If one leg is missing or weak, the stool becomes unstable. Similarly, in our Christian walk, if we neglect one of these, our ability to navigate challenges and remain faithful will be compromised.

Remaining Faithful in Opposition

Opposition can come in many forms: persecution for our faith, ridicule, subtle pressures to compromise, or even internal doubts.

- **Rejoicing in Hope:** When opposition comes, remembering our eternal hope helps us not to be shaken. Our ultimate allegiance is to Christ, and His kingdom is eternal. This gives us courage to stand firm.
- **Patient in Tribulation:** Opposition is tribulation. Being patient means not retaliating in kind, not becoming bitter, and enduring the attacks with grace and steadfastness, trusting God to vindicate and work all things for good.
- **Constant in Prayer:** This is our most powerful weapon against opposition. We pray for wisdom, for strength, for those who oppose us, and for God's will to be done. Prayer shifts the battle to God, who is greater than any opposition.

The early church faced intense opposition and persecution, yet they "continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers" (Acts 2:42). Their hope, patience, and prayer sustained them.

The Instructions

"That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honour and glory." (1 Peter 1:7)

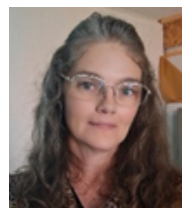
The Final Result
